HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL City of Long Beach California

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation to declare ordinance amending the Long Beach Municipal Code by amending Sections 10.24.005, 10.24.077, 10.24.078, 10.24.079, and 10.24.080; by adding Section 10.24.081; and by repealing Section 10.24.076, all relating to parking of oversized vehicles, read the first time and laid over to the next regular meeting of the City Council for final reading.

Adopt a Resolution directing the Director of Public Works to submit a request to the California Coastal Commission to certify an amendment to the certified Local Coastal Program.

Find that the proposed action is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3) (General Rule) (Citywide).

DISCUSSION

This office has prepared and now submits for your consideration the attached amendments to Long Beach Municipal Code Section 10.24.078 et seq., prohibiting parking of an oversized vehicle, as defined, on residential streets in the City of Long Beach, without a valid permit issued by the Department of Public Works, Traffic Engineering division. Residents and their sponsored visitors would be able to park oversized vehicles registered to them adjacent to their residences for a maximum of seventy-two (72) consecutive hours. An annual maximum of twenty (20) oversized vehicle permits could be issued to a resident.

Pursuant to Council motion on June 11, 2017, the following exceptions to the oversized vehicle permit requirement have also been included:

 Exceptions to the 72-hour parking limit and the 20-permit annual maximum may be requested in writing from the Traffic Engineer upon a showing of good cause. Applicants will be required to show proof of a current, valid rental or other agreement for storage of the applicant's oversized vehicle.

- An exception may be requested in writing from the City Traffic Engineer if an
 oversized vehicle otherwise prohibited by Section 10.24.080 is used on a daily
 basis and on-premises parking is not reasonably available. A permit issued
 based on this finding shall not be valid for longer than six months.
- The request to place an item on the Planning Commission agenda to allow oversized vehicles to be parked outside of an enclosure will be handled separately.

Disability Exemption

Since the June 11, 2017 Council hearing on this item, an issue was raised by disabled residents whose primary means of transportation is their oversized vehicle. In consultation with the City's disability coordinator, it was determined to be necessary to include in the ordinance amendment an exemption to provide a reasonable accommodation for disabled residents. The proposed language would allow the issuance of a permit for residents to park an oversized vehicle adjacent to their residence upon proof to the City Traffic Engineer of the following circumstances:

- They own or lawfully possess an oversized vehicle, which is used as their primary means of transportation;
- They are permanent resident(s) of the City of Long Beach;
- They possess a valid, distinguishing disabled placard or license plate properly issued pursuant to the California Vehicle Code; and
- They can demonstrate that by reason of the disability which warranted issuance of their California distinguishing placard or license plate, the oversized vehicle is specially equipped and necessary to accommodate the disability of the person seeking the permit so that a reasonable modification to the City's on-street parking regulations is warranted under state and federal law.

The permit will allow parking where the applicant resides, at a facility at which the applicant receives services, or at the applicant's place of employment. The Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit provides an exception to the oversized vehicle parking prohibition only. All other parking restrictions apply, including but not limited to the 72-hour parking restriction and posted street cleaning closures.

Coastal Commission Approval

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the attached draft ordinance and adopt a Resolution directing the Department of Public Works to submit this ordinance amendment to the California Coastal Commission for a Local Coastal Program (LCP) Amendment.

California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") Determination.

In adopting the ordinance and resolution, it is recommended that the City Council make a finding that the project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Title 14, California Code of Regulations Section 15061(b)(3), in that it can be seen with certainty that the adoption of the amendments to the Long Beach Municipal Code propose no activity that may have a significant effect on the environment and will not cause a direct physical

change in the environment or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment.

SUGGESTED ACTION:

Approve recommendation.

10.24.005 - Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply to this Chapter:

A. "City Entrance Streets" means all streets crossing City boundaries entering the City of Long Beach and all freeway exit ramps within the City.

B. "Oversized Vehicle" means a vehicle which exceeds eighty-five inches (85") high or eighty inches (80") wide or twenty-two feet (220') long on a residential street or eighty-five inches (85") high or twenty-two feet (220') long, as determined by Department of Motor Vehicles records, exclusive of projecting lights or devices allowed by Section 35109 or 35110 of the California Vehicle Code, as may be amended, on a nonresidential street. A boat, equipment or other object on or attached to a trailer shall be measured together with the trailer.

BC. "Nonresidential street" means a street or portion thereof on which the majority of traffic is nonresidential, and which is adjacent to property on which the majority of uses are commercial, industrial or institutional.

©D. "Residential street" means a street or portion thereof adjacent to property on which the majority of uses are residential in nature.

DE. "Permitted eCommercial Loading Period" means the time allowed for the actual loading or unloading of goods. The permitted commercial loading period shall be twenty (20) minutes, or such other time period as posted by the City Traffic Engineer.

10.24.076 - Continuation of existing oversized vehicle regulation.

Repealed. Except as otherwise provided in this Chapter, and except as amended or altered from time to time under the authority of this Chapter, all oversized vehicle restrictions and prohibitions heretofore placed in the City shall remain in full force and effect. The elimination from this Code of previously enumerated locations for such regulation does not constitute the repeal of such regulations.

10.24.077 - Posting of restrictions.

The City Traffic Engineer shall place and maintain or cause to be placed and maintained, on City Entrance Streetseach of the streets or portions of streets on which oversized vehicle parking is restricted, appropriate signs notifying the public of Oversized Vehicle residential parking such restrictions.

10.24.078 - Parking of Oversized Vehicles prohibited.

A. Where posted, nNo person who owns, has custody, or control of an "eOversized vVehicle" as defined in Section 10.24.005, shall cause it to be parked in a residential area, as defined in Section 10.24.005, on any public street.

B. Subsection A of this Section shall not apply to an eoversized vehicle, so long as it is parked in a manner which otherwise complies with applicable State law and the City of Long Beach Municipal Code, when a valid permit is displayed on the inside of the lower left corner of the windshield of an eoversized vehicle so as to be visible from the street. The permit shall state the address of the resident and the permit shall only be valid within the same block as the resident's address, on either side of the street. A resident may obtain an Oversized Vehicle parking permit for a non-resident visitor temporarily residing with the resident under the same terms as set forth herein. Said permit may be obtained and displayed in accordance with Section 10.24.080 of this Chapter.

C. Subsection A of this Section shall not apply to a commercial vehicle which is engaged in the active loading or unloading of goods for a period of time which does not exceed the "pPermitted commercial Loading pPeriod" as defined in Section 10.24.005.

10.24.079 - Designation and termination of eoversized vvehicle parking restrictions in nonresidential areas.

<u>In nonresidential areas</u>, <u>↓i</u>nstallation or removal of <u>oO</u>versized <u>vV</u>ehicle parking restrictions may be initiated in one (1) of the following ways:

A. Safety/traffic hazards. The City Traffic Engineer may install or remove

eOversized Vehicle parking restrictions from one (1) or both sides of any street or block when the need has been established by evidence satisfactory to the City Traffic Engineer based on factors including, but not limited to, street size and width, traffic patterns and volume, traffic on nearby streets or street segments, location of the street in the parking impacted area, neighborhood characteristics and City-wide traffic plans; or

B. Petition. The City Traffic Engineer is authorized to install or remove Oversized Vehicle parking restrictions from one (1) or both sides of any street or block upon receipt of a petition containing the signatures of occupants of two-thirds (-2/3-) of the street addresses of properties with front curbs proposed to be affected by the action. The City Traffic Engineer shall make available for this purpose a petition form containing the street addresses of said properties. In the case of nonresidential properties, the petition must contain the signatures of owners or owners' agents for at least two-thirds (-2/3-) of the linear street frontage described on the petition, irrespective of the property's legal address; or

C. Council district office. As an alternative to the petition process, the City Traffic Engineer is authorized to install or remove Oversized Vehicle parking restrictions from one (1) or both sides of any street or block upon receipt of a written request from a Council district office and a determination by the City Traffic Engineer that there is either majority support for or lack of sufficient opposition to the proposed restrictions. The City Traffic Engineer's determination shall be based on responses from occupants of properties with front curbs proposed to be affected by the action received after notice of the proposed restrictions.

10.24.080 - Oversized vVehicle forty-eightseventy-two hour parking permit for residential streets.

A. The Fire Department City Traffic Engineer in the Public Works department, or such other department as the City Manager shall designate, is authorized to issue eOversized

recreational vehicles for the purpose of such activities as loading, unloading or performing maintenance on such vehicles for a period of not more than forty-eightseventy-two (4872) hours. Such activities must be conducted in compliance with all other laws and regulations. No more than twelvetwenty (1220) permits shall be issued to any one (1) eligible resident or to any one (1) eligible vehicle within one (1) calendar year and a twenty-four (24) hour period must elapse between permits.

- B. Oversized Vehicle parking permits shall be issued for motor vehicles upon application of the registered owner or such other person who can provide evidence of residency at a location at which on-street parking of Oversized Vehicles is prohibited and can demonstrate exclusive use and control of the vehicle for which application is made.
- C. Each Oversized Vehicle parking permit shall be issued for a period not to exceed forty-eightseventy-two (4872) hours in duration. Each application or reapplication for Oversized Vehicle parking permits shall be in writing and shall contain sufficient information to satisfy the administering department as to the identity and residential address of the applicant, the applicant's registered ownership or exclusive use and control of the vehicle for which application is made, the license number of the vehicle, and any other information that the administering department deems necessary for the proper processing of the application.
- D. The Fire ChiefCity Traffic Engineer or his designee may place further restrictions on any permit issued as deemed necessary to protect the public health and safety. Such restrictions shall appear on the face of the permit which shall be displayed on the inside of the windshield of the vehicle for which the permit is issued so as to be readily visible to a person approaching the vehicle from the front thereof.
- E. Applications for issuance of forty-eightseventy-two (2472) hour permits shall be accompanied by such fee therefor as may be established from time to time by resolution of the City Council.
- F. Exceptions: The City Traffic Engineer may issue Oversized Vehicle permits when an application made in writing and containing a statement of reasons,

- -1. A time extension for not more than forty-eight (48) additional consecutive hours;
- 2. Additional Oversized Vehicle parking permit(s) after the twenty (20) annual permit maximum has been reached;
- 3. A temporary permit to park an Oversized Vehicle otherwise prohibited by Section 10.24.078 if there is a finding that the Oversized Vehicle is used on a daily basis and on-premises parking is not reasonably available. A permit issued based on this finding shall not be valid for longer than six (6) months.

For applications under subsections F(1) and (2), applicants will be required to show proof of a current, valid rental or other agreement for storage of the applicant's Oversized Vehicle.

10.24.081. Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit

- 1. Permit Issuance. The City Traffic Engineer is authorized to issue permits for disabled persons to park Oversized Vehicles which are needed as a result of their disability.
- 2. Eligibility and Duration. To be eligible for an Oversized Vehicle Disability

 Parking Permit, a person must:
 - a. Eligibility.
- i. Own or lawfully possess an Oversized Vehicle, which is used as their primary vehicle.
 - ii. Be a permanent resident of the City of Long Beach.
- iii. Possess a valid, distinguishing disabled placard or license plate properly issued pursuant to the California Vehicle Code.
- iv. Demonstrate that by reason of the disability which warranted issuance of their California distinguishing placard or license plate, the Oversized Vehicle is specially equipped and necessary to accommodate the disability of the person seeking the permit

so that a reasonable modification to the City's on-street parking regulations is warranted under state and federal law. If an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit applicant or permit holder fails or refuses to provide the information required by these rules and regulations, the City Traffic Engineer may, but need not, obtain from the Department of Motor Vehicles the information allowed by Vehicle Code section 22511.58(a). When he or she deems it necessary or advisable, the City Traffic Engineer may convene a review panel for the purposes enumerated in Vehicle Code section 22511.58(b).

b. Duration.

i. The permit will be valid for one year, and is renewable. A single permit may be issued for each location at which the applicant resides, and at each facility at which the applicant receives services.

The Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit provides an exception to the Oversized Vehicle parking prohibition only. All other parking restrictions apply, including but not limited to the seventy-two (72) hour parking restriction and posted street cleaning closures.

- 3.. Application Process. To obtain an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit, a person must:
- a. Be eligible for an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit under Long Beach Municipal Code Section 10.24.081 2;
- b. Provide complete and correct information on the application for an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit.
- c. Provide current California Vehicle Registration for the vehicle for which an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit is requested. If the vehicle is not owned by the applicant, sufficient evidence must be presented to prove that the applicant has the legal right to use the vehicle.
- d. Provide a copy of a valid disabled parking placard properly issued pursuant to the California Vehicle Code OR provide current California Vehicle Registration for the vehicle for which the permit is requested that indicates that the vehicle has valid and

properly issued disabled license plate.

- 4. Application Review and Permit Issuance. Upon receipt of a complete application for an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit, and prior to issuing any such permit, the City Traffic Engineer shall:
- a. Review the application and all supporting materials for completeness and compliance with LBMC 10.24.081.
- b. Inspect the Oversized Vehicle to determine whether it is specially equipped and necessary to accommodate the applicant's disability.
- c. Review the requested parking locations to verify that they are a legal dwelling unit where the applicant resides, or a facility at which the applicant receives services, or the applicant's place of employment. A single permit may be approved for multiple locations or, as appropriate, citywide use subject to the approved parking locations.

5. Specific Oversized Vehicle.

- a. An Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit may only be used upon the vehicle that was identified in the application for the permit and inspected by the City Traffic Engineer or his or her designee. If the vehicle is not owned by the applicant, sufficient evidence must be presented to prove that the applicant has the legal right to use the vehicle. At such time as the vehicle is no longer used by the applicant, the permit holder shall return the permit to the City Traffic Engineer. To qualify for an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit, the size of the applicant's vehicle must be necessary to accommodate the required on-street parking modification.
 - b. Approved Parking Locations.
- i. An Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit is only valid at the locations approved by the City upon permit issuance.
- ii. An Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit may only be approved for use at:
 - 1. the legal dwelling unit at which the applicant resides;

- 2. any location or facility at which the applicant receives services, or
- 3. the applicant's place of employment.
- iii. The permitted parking location cannot create or exacerbate a traffic safety hazard. An oversized vehicle may not be parked at any location that leaves less than 10 feet in the adjacent travel lane, or within 40 feet of any driveway or intersection. Doing so could result in revocation of the permit, and possible citation. Some streets may not be able to accommodate oversized vehicles due to street width or driveway frequency.
- 6. Grounds for Refusal to Issue or Revocation of an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit. Any of the following are grounds for refusal to issue or revocation of an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit:
- a. Lawful possession of vehicle. The applicant fails to demonstrate that he or she owns or lawfully possesses the Oversized Vehicle for which he or she seeks a permit.
- b. Incomplete application. The applicant fails to provide complete and correct information as required by the City.
- c. Oversized Vehicle not necessary to accommodate disability. The oversized nature of the applicant's vehicle is not necessary to accommodate a disability, or the oversized nature of the vehicle is not necessary to accommodate a modification that is necessary to for a disability.
- d. Dangerous Traffic Safety Condition. The permit holder uses the permit to park in a manner that creates or exacerbates a dangerous traffic safety condition.
- e. Improper use. The permit holder uses the permit on a vehicle not approved by the City and designated on the permit, or the permit holder uses the permit at a location not approved by the City and designated on the permit, or the permit holder gives the permit to an ineligible vehicle or person for use.
- f. Failure to comply with all laws, rules, and regulations. The permit holder fails to comply with any City law, rule, or regulation pertaining to Oversized Vehicle permit parking.
 - 7. Supplemental Disability Determination Consultation

a. An unsuccessful Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit applicant
may seek consultation with the City's Disability Coordinator. The Disability Coordinator may
also consult with the City Traffic Engineer to assure reasonable modifications to any City
program, including on-street parking, when warranted to provide equal access for a person
with disabilities.

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

10.24.005 Parking of oversized vehicles prohibited.

- A. "City Entrance Streets" means all streets crossing City boundaries entering the City of Long Beach and all freeway exit ramps within the City.
- B. "Oversized Vehicle" means a vehicle which exceeds eighty-five inches (85") high or eighty inches (80") wide or twenty-two feet (22') long on a residential street or eighty-five inches (85") high or twenty-two feet (22') long, as determined by Department of Motor Vehicles records, exclusive of projecting lights or devices allowed by Section 35109 or 35110 of the California Vehicle Code, as may be amended, on a nonresidential street. A boat, equipment or other object on or attached to a trailer shall be measured together with the trailer.
 - C. "Nonresidential street" means a street or portion thereof on

The City Traffic Engineer in the Public Works department, or such other department as the City Manager shall designate, is authorized to issue Oversized Vehicle parking permits for campers, trailers, boats on trailers and recreational vehicles for the purpose of such activities as loading, unloading or performing maintenance on such vehicles for a period of not more than seventy-two (72) hours. Such activities must be conducted in compliance with all other laws and regulations. No more than twenty (20) permits shall be issued to any one (1) eligible resident or to any one (1)

eligible vehicle within one (1) calendar year and a twenty-four (24) hour period must elapse between permits.

- B. Oversized Vehicle parking permits shall be issued for motor vehicles upon application of the registered owner or such other person who can provide evidence of residency at a location at which on-street parking of Oversized Vehicles is prohibited and can demonstrate exclusive use and control of the vehicle for which application is made.
- C. Each Oversized Vehicle parking permit shall be issued for a period not to exceed seventy-two (72) hours in duration. Each application or reapplication for Oversized Vehicle parking permits shall be in writing and shall contain sufficient information to satisfy the administering department as to the identity and residential address of the applicant, the applicant's registered ownership or exclusive use and control of the vehicle for which application is made, the license number of the vehicle, and any other information that the administering department deems necessary for the proper processing of the application.
- D. The City Traffic Engineer or his designee may place further restrictions on any permit issued as deemed necessary to protect the public health and safety. Such restrictions shall appear on the face of the permit which shall be displayed on the inside of the windshield of the vehicle for which the permit is issued so as to be readily visible to a person approaching the vehicle from the front thereof.
- E. Applications for issuance of seventy-two (72) hour permits shall be accompanied by such fee therefor as may be established from time to time by resolution of the City Council.
- F. Exceptions. The City Traffic Engineer may issue Oversized Vehicle permits when an application made in writing and containing a statement of reasons, establishes good cause in the following

circumstances:

- A time extension for not more than forty-eight (48)
 additional consecutive hours;
- 2. Additional Oversized Vehicle parking permit(s) after the twenty (20) annual permit maximum has been reached;
- 3. A temporary permit to park an Oversized Vehicle otherwise prohibited by Section 10.24.078 if there is a finding that the Oversized Vehicle is used on a daily basis and on-premises parking is not reasonably available. A permit issued based on this finding shall not be valid for longer than six (6) months.

For applications under subsections F(1) and (2), applicants will be required to show proof of a current, valid rental or other agreement for storage of the applicant's Oversized Vehicle.

Section 6. Section 10.24.081 is added to the Long Beach Municipal Code to read as follows:

10.24.081 Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit.

- A. Permit issuance. The City Traffic Engineer is authorized to issue permits for disabled persons to park Oversized Vehicles which are needed as a result of their disability.
- B. Eligibility and duration. To be eligible for an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit, a person must:
 - Eligibility.
- a. Own or lawfully possess an Oversized Vehicle, which is used as their primary vehicle.
- b. Be a permanent resident of the City of Long Beach.
 - c. Possess a valid, distinguishing disabled placard

or license plate properly issued pursuant to the California Vehicle Code.

d. Demonstrate that by reason of the disability which warranted issuance of their California distinguishing placard or license plate, the Oversized Vehicle is specially equipped and necessary to accommodate the disability of the person seeking the permit so that a reasonable modification to the City's on-street parking regulations is warranted under State and federal law. If an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit applicant or permit holder fails or refuses to provide the information required by these rules and regulations, the City Traffic Engineer may, but need not, obtain from the Department of Motor Vehicles the information allowed by Vehicle Code section 22511.58(a). When he or she deems it necessary or advisable, the City Traffic Engineer may convene a review panel for the purposes enumerated in Vehicle Code section 22511.58(b).

Duration.

- a. The Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit will be valid for one (1) year, and is renewable. A single permit may be issued for each location at which the applicant resides, and at each facility at which the applicant receives services.
- b. The Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit provides an exception to the Oversized Vehicle parking prohibition only. All other parking restrictions apply, including but not limited to the seventy-two (72) hour parking restriction and posted street cleaning closures.
- C. Application Process. To obtain an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit, a person must:
- Be eligible for an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking
 Permit under Section 10.24.081.B.
 - 2. Provide complete and correct information on the

application for an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit.

- Provide current California Vehicle Registration for the 3. vehicle for which an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit is requested. If the vehicle is not owned by the applicant, sufficient evidence must be presented to prove that the applicant has the legal right to use the vehicle.
- 4. Provide a copy of a valid disabled parking placard properly issued pursuant to the California Vehicle Code OR provide current California Vehicle Registration for the vehicle for which the permit is requested that indicates that the vehicle has valid and properly issued disabled license plate.
- D. Application Review and Permit Issuance. Upon receipt of a complete application for an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit, and prior to issuing any such permit, the City Traffic Engineer shall:
- 1. Review the application and all supporting materials for completeness and compliance with Section 10.24.081.
- 2 Inspect the Oversized Vehicle to determine whether it is specially equipped and necessary to accommodate the applicant's disability.
- 3. Review the requested parking locations to verify that they are a legal dwelling unit where the applicant resides, or a facility at which the applicant receives services, or the applicant's place of employment. A single permit may be approved for multiple locations or, as appropriate, Citywide use subject to the approved parking locations.
 - E. Specific Oversized Vehicle.
- 1. An Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit may only be used upon the vehicle that was identified in the application for the permit and inspected by the City Traffic Engineer or his or her designee. If

the vehicle is not owned by the applicant, sufficient evidence must be presented to prove that the applicant has the legal right to use the vehicle. At such time as the vehicle is no longer used by the applicant, the permit holder shall return the permit to the City Traffic Engineer. To qualify for an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit, the size of the applicant's vehicle must be necessary to accommodate the required on-street parking modification.

- 2. Approved Parking Locations.
- An Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit is only valid at the locations approved by the City upon permit issuance.
- An Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit b. may only be approved for use at:
- (i) the legal dwelling unit at which the applicant resides;
- (ii) any location or facility at which the applicant receives services, or
 - the applicant's place of employment. (iii)
- The permitted parking location cannot create or exacerbate a traffic safety hazard. An oversized vehicle may not be parked at any location that leaves less than ten feet (10') in the adjacent travel lane, or within forty feet (40') of any driveway or intersection. Doing so could result in revocation of the permit, and possible citation. Some streets may not be able to accommodate oversized vehicles due to street width or driveway frequency.
- Grounds for Refusal to Issue or Revocation of an Oversized F. Vehicle Disability Parking Permit. Any of the following are grounds for refusal to issue or revocation of an Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit:

- 1. Lawful possession of vehicle. The applicant fails to demonstrate that he or she owns or lawfully possesses the Oversized Vehicle for which he or she seeks a permit.
- Incomplete application. The applicant fails to provide 2. complete and correct information as required by the City.
- 3. Oversized Vehicle not necessary to accommodate disability. The oversized nature of the applicant's vehicle is not necessary to accommodate a disability, or the oversized nature of the vehicle is not necessary to accommodate a modification that is necessary to for a disability.
- 4. Dangerous Traffic Safety Condition. The permit holder uses the permit to park in a manner that creates or exacerbates a dangerous traffic safety condition.
- Improper use. The permit holder uses the permit on a 5. vehicle not approved by the City and designated on the permit, or the permit holder uses the permit at a location not approved by the City and designated on the permit, or the permit holder gives the permit to an ineligible vehicle or person for use.
- Failure to comply with all laws, rules, and regulations. 6. The permit holder fails to comply with any City law, rule, or regulation pertaining to Oversized Vehicle permit parking.
 - Supplemental Disability Determination Consultation G.
- 1. An unsuccessful Oversized Vehicle Disability Parking Permit applicant may seek consultation with the City's Disability Coordinator. The Disability Coordinator may also consult with the City Traffic Engineer to assure reasonable modifications to any City program, including on-street parking, when warranted to provide equal access for a person with disabilities.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS TO SUBMIT AMENDMENTS TO THE LONG BEACH MUNICIPAL CODE TO THE CALIFORNIA COASTAL COMMISSION FOR APPROVAL AND MAKING A CEQA DETERMINATION.

WHEREAS, on ______, 2017, the City Council of the City of Long Beach amended certain provisions of Title 10 of the Long Beach Municipal Code, relating to parking of oversized vehicles; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council to submit the above referenced amendments to the Long Beach Municipal Code to the California Coastal Commission for its review; and

WHEREAS, the City Council gave full consideration to all facts and the proposals respecting the amendments to the Long Beach Municipal Code at a properly noticed and advertised public meeting; and

WHEREAS, the City Council approved the proposed amendments to the by adopting amendments to Title 10. The proposed amendments are to be carried out in a manner fully consistent with the Coastal Act and become effective in the Coastal Zone immediately upon Coastal Commission certification; and

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby finds that the proposed amendments will not adversely affect the character, livability or appropriate development in the City of Long Beach and that the amendments are consistent with the goals, objectives and provisions of the General Plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. The amendments to the Long Beach Municipal Code adopted					
on, 2017, by Ordinance No. ORD-17, a copy of which is					
attached to and incorporated in this resolution is hereby submitted to the California					
Coastal Commission for its earliest review as to that part of the ordinance that directly					
affects land use matters in that portion of the California Coastal Zone within the City of					
Long Beach.					
Section 2. The Director of Public Works of the City of Long Beach is					
hereby authorized to and shall submit a certified copy of this resolution, together with					
appropriate supporting materials, to the California Coastal Commission with a request for					
its earliest action, as an amendment to the Local Coastal Program that will take effect					
automatically upon Commission approval pursuant to the Public Resources Code or as					
an amendment that will require formal City Council adoption after Coastal Commission					
approval.					
Section 3. CEQA Determination. The City Council finds that the project					
is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to					
Title 14, California Code of Regulations Section 15061(b)(3), in that it can be seen with					
certainty that the adoption of the amendments to the Long Beach Municipal Code					
propose no activity that may have a significant effect on the environment and will not					
cause a direct physical change in the environment or a reasonably foreseeable indirect					
physical change in the environment.					
Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption					
by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
