Exceptional Customer Service




- 90,000 Long Beach customer accounts
- Staffed 24/7 for water and sewer emergencies
- Handle 10,000 water emergency service calls a year



Exceptional Water Quality

 Long Beach's water meets or exceeds ALL federal and state water quality standards

 LBWD's skilled scientists and technicians perform 57,000 water quality tests annually






Reinvestment in Infrastructure



- Maintain 2,500 miles of underground water/sewer pipelines
- Over 225 miles of water main pipeline replaced since 1991
- Reinvesting \$17.5 million in pipeline replacement and other CIP work

Annual Water Main Breaks

80% drop in main breaks in past 25 years





Technology

Assisting Parks/Rec by installing 20 smart meters to locate leaks in irrigation system







Trenchless technology for sewer line repairs

Sonar technology provides advanced warning of rising sewer levels





Reorg Focus on Quality Control

- > New Director of Field Ops to oversee both Water & Sewer field work
- > New Supt of Water Construction to focus on all water pipeline work
- > Increased Inspection team to 8 inspectors (contracted in)





Reorg Focus on Quality Control

- ➤ All pipeline street work now treated as one project at a time from start to finish, under one field Supervisor
- > All work is now reviewed by an Inspector to ensure quality control
- > Fully in compliance with Public Works specs, NO exceptions





Sustainability - Long Beach Style



- Water use efficiency is our way of life
- Double digit water use reductions this summer
- Long Beach is using about same volume of water as it did in 1950s

(despite 40% population increase)



Sustainability – Long Beach Style



- 65% of a home's water use is for outside irrigation
- L2G incentives of up to \$3,750 for eligible customers
- 6 million sq ft of thirsty turf replaced thru LBWD incentives



Future Capital Needs





- Development of new local water wells and storage
- Expansion of reclaimed water
- Greatly increase the number of valve replacements
- Possible transition of 90,000 water meters to smart meters

Expenditures \$106,381,569


Revenues \$ 103,031,369







Water Supply Cost Increases





- 4% cost increase for water imported from Northern California and from Colorado River
- 5% increase in pumping costs for local groundwater supplies

Expenditures \$22,024,667


Revenues \$19,000,546







Sewer Cost Increases



- Regulations increasing costs for inspecting and maintaining LBWD sewer system
- Paying down Sewer Fund's outstanding debt

Proposed Rate Adjustment

4% water rate increase

2% sewer rate increase

Draw down on reserves to keep increases moderate:

\$3.4 million - Water


\$3.0 million - Sewer

Combined Water/Sewer Bill Comparison






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
