1 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH ESTABLISHING A CITY OF LONG BEACH QUEEN MARY LAND DEVELOPMENT TASK

FORCE

Whereas, the Queen Mary is one of Long Beach's greatest assets, attracting thousands of visitors every year and providing an iconic element of the City of Long Beach ("City") skyline and coast; and

Whereas, the City, working with the Queen Mary's operator, Garrison Investment or its successor, is ready to formulate a comprehensive plan for the development of the surrounding properties; and

Whereas, in order to develop the optimal approach to reimagining the land around the Queen Mary and its place in our City's economic and cultural life, the involvement of the community is vital; and

WHEREAS, on June 23, 2015, the City Council requested the City Manager convene a twelve (12)-member Queen Mary Land Development Task Force (the "Proposed Task Force"), appointed by the Mayor, including downtown residents as well as experts in tourism and hospitality, design and architecture, and historic preservation; and

WHEREAS, Long Beach Municipal Code Section 2.03.075 provides that any proposal to create or form any citizen advisory committee, commission, board, task force or other such entity shall require a fiscal impact analysis report be prepared by the City Manager and reviewed by the Economic and Development Finance Committee ("ED&F Committee"), and the ED&F Committee shall immediately thereafter submit its comments to the City Council relating to: (a) the feasibility of the cost estimates and recommended appropriation ceiling; and (b) any public or private revenue sources or

enhancements that may be available; and (c) the most appropriate City or private sector resources to furnish support for the proposed board, committee, commission or task force; and

WHEREAS, on December 15, 2015, the ED&F Committee held a noticed public meeting to review the fiscal impact analysis report prepared by the City Manager for the Proposed Task Force; and

WHEREAS, on December 22, 2015, the ED&F Committee submitted its comments to the City Council relating to the fiscal determinations for the Proposed Task Force: and

WHEREAS, the City Council determines that it will be beneficial and appropriate for the City Council to convene an ad hoc Queen Mary Land Development Task Force for the purpose of providing the City Council with input and recommendations for the development of the surrounding properties to the Queen Mary; and

WHEREAS, Long Beach Municipal Code Section 2.18.020 provides that the City Council may create and establish, from time to time, temporary committees or task forces to give counsel and advice to the City Council on various matters within its jurisdiction;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

- Section 1. The City Council hereby establishes the City of Long Beach Queen Mary Land Development Task Force (the "Task Force").
- Section 2. The Task Force shall advise the City Council on the development of the surrounding properties to the Queen Mary.
- Section 3. The Task Force shall consist of twelve (12) members. appointed by the Mayor, the names of which shall be transmitted to the City Clerk for recordation and dissemination.
- Section 4. The Task Force shall meet as necessary and convenient in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act in order to discuss

and receive public input regarding the development of the surrounding properties to the Queen Mary, and shall endeavor to provide its advice and recommendation(s) to the Mayor, City Council, City staff and the Queen Mary operator for moving forward with the Queen Mary land development process. Section 5. Services of the members of the Task Force shall be voluntary and members of the Task Force will serve without compensation. Section 6. The Task Force shall select a Chair from among its members who shall fairly chair and facilitate Task Force meetings, coordinate with City staff to set an agenda for Task Force meetings, and serve as a liaison to the City Council with respect to the duties and responsibilities of the Task Force. Section 7. The Task Force shall be dissolved upon the completion of the objectives for which it has been created, unless otherwise directed by the City Council by Resolution. Section 8. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
