HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL City of Long Beach California

RECOMMENDATION:

Amend Agreement with Steve Aichele, dba Pacific Coast Tank, to extend current professional services for the City's Underground Storage Tank Program through December 31, 2009 and increase the Agreement by an amount not to exceed \$145,000. (Citywide)

DISCUSSION

Since January 1, 2005, Steve Aichele, dba Pacific Coast Tank (PacTank), has provided professional services as a designated Underground Storage Tank Operator licensed by the State of California. The Department of Public Works, Fleet Services Bureau, did not have staff with the expertise to comply with the regulatory rules and regulations and, therefore, sought to contract these services in order to achieve and maintain compliance with the California State Water Resources Board (CSWRB) and California Air Resources Board (CARB). As the rules and regulations evolve and associated technologies change, it is necessary that the City remain abreast of the changes with the help of a technical expert in the field.

A blanket purchase order was approved in the amount of \$95,000 for the period October 1, 2008 through September 30, 2009. Due to the unanticipated creation of a comprehensive Underground Storage Tank Compliance Plan and in order for PacTank to continue to provide their professional services on current projects, an additional \$145,000 of contract authority is needed. In addition, the Fleet Services Bureau is requesting to extend the current Agreement through December 31, 2009 while the development of a new scope of services is drafted and a Request for Proposals is conducted. The Department of Public Works intends to come back to City Council prior to December 31, 2009 to award a new Agreement. PacTank has been providing consulting services with the underground storage tank projects since 2005 with repairs ongoing at a number of sites. Bidding out the project at this time would have detrimental effects on the status of compliance, timing of repairs, and continuity of current project management.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Gary Anderson on June 22, 2009, and by Budget and Performance Management Bureau Manager David Wodynski on June 24, 2009.

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TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action on this matter is requested on July 14, 2009, to ensure that a contract is in place in order to continue uninterrupted Designated Operator services which are necessary to maintain compliance of all underground storage tanks (UST) under Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations.

FISCAL IMPACT

The agreement's expenditure disbursed through the purchase order will not exceed \$240,000. Of this amount, \$161,438 is budgeted in the Fleet Services Fund (IS 386) in the Department of Public Works (PW). The balance of \$78,562 is budgeted in the Tidelands Funds (TF), Airport Fund (EF 320) and Water Fund (EF 310).

SUGGESTED ACTION:

Approve recommendation.
