A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA, PROVIDING FOR THE FILING OF PRIMARY AND REBUTTAL ARGUMENTS AND SETTING RULES FOR THE FILING OF WRITTEN ARGUMENTS REGARDING A CITY CHARTER AMENDMENT MEASURE TO BE SUBMITTED AT THE JUNE 5, 2018 GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election is to be held in the City of Long Beach, California on June 5, 2018, at which there will be submitted to the voters the following City charter amendment measure ("City Measure"):

"City of Long Beach Utility Revenue Transfer Charter Amendment. To maintain general City services like 9-1-1 emergency response, police/fire protection, street/pothole repairs, senior services, parks and libraries, shall the City of Long Beach amend its Charter to authorize annual fund transfers from the City's water, sewer and gas utilities to the General Fund not to exceed 12% of utility gross revenues, generating approximately \$25,500,000 annually for unrestricted general revenue purposes, requiring annual independent audits, until ended by voters?"

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as

Section 1. Primary Arguments. That pursuant to Long Beach Municipal Code Section 1.24.020, the Mayor, with the approval of the City Council, may designate a person, or association of persons, to write primary arguments either for or against or both for and against a city measure. In doing so, the Mayor shall designate one of the following:

A. The Mayor;

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- An elected officer of the City; B.
- C. An appointive officer of the City;
- D. An association of citizens; or
- E. An individual voter.

That pursuant to said authority, the Mayor, with the approval of the City Council, hereby designates the following person(s) to write primary arguments with regard to the City Measure:

For the City Measure:	Robert Garcia, Mayor, Michael DuRee,
Fire Chief, and Robert Luna, Police Chief.	
Against the City Measure: Diana Lejins, Taxpayers Rights	
Advocate, E. Gerrie Schipske, Attorney, Thomas Stout, Long	
Beach Taxpayers Association, and Joseph Weinstein, CARP.	

All arguments shall be submitted in accordance with Article 4, Chapter 3, Division 9 of the Elections Code of the State of California and Long Beach Municipal Code Chapter 1.24. Author(s) may change an argument until and including the date fixed below by the City Clerk, after which no arguments for or against the City Measure may be submitted to the City Clerk.

The deadline to submit arguments for or against the City Measure pursuant to this Resolution is declared by the City Clerk to be Friday, March 16, 2018, at 4:30 p.m. Each argument shall not exceed 300 words and shall be filed with the City Clerk, signed, and include the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument.

Rebuttal Arguments. Pursuant to Section 9285 of the Section 2. Elections Code of the State of California and Long Beach Municipal Code Section 1.24.040, when the City Clerk has selected the primary arguments for and against the City Measure which will be printed and distributed to the voters, the Clerk shall send

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copies of the primary argument in favor of the City Measure to the author(s) of the primary argument against, and copies of the primary argument against to the author(s) of the primary argument in favor. The authors or persons designated by them may prepare and submit rebuttal arguments not exceeding 250 words. The rebuttal arguments shall be filed with the City Clerk not later than Tuesday, March 27, 2018 at 4:30 p.m. Author(s) may change a rebuttal argument until and including the date fixed above by the City Clerk, after which no rebuttal arguments for or against the City Measure may be submitted to the City Clerk. Rebuttal arguments shall be printed in the same manner as the primary arguments. Each rebuttal argument shall immediately follow the primary argument which it seeks to rebut.

Section 3. Prior Resolutions. That all previous resolutions providing for the filing of primary and rebuttal arguments related to City measures are repealed.

June 5, 2018 Election. That the provisions of Sections 1 and Section 4. 2 shall apply only to the election to be held on June 5, 2018, and shall then be repealed.

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption Section 5. by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
