Subject:

Requisite Costs for Fire Recruit - Recruitment and Testing Process

At the Personnel and Civil Service Committee meeting of May 22, 2007, there was discussion, followed by a motion, to recommend to the full City Council that testing for entry level Fire Recruit be conducted eight to nine months prior to every training academy, and that appropriate resources be allocated for this activity.

The cost for this supplemental activity in the Civil Service Department alone is \$260,700. This cost does not include needed office space to house additional staff.

Attached is information regarding the costs to recruit and test Fire Recruit candidates, including detailed breakdowns of Personal, Non-Personal and Interdepartmental costs. With outreach recruitment being conducted year round, coupled with the customary high interest in this position, annual posting for four weeks will draw an average of 5,000 candidates.

The information provided clearly illustrates that this is a very costly examination to conduct on an annual basis. Should the council approve the recommendation presented by the Personnel and Civil Service Committee, be advised that the costs presented include the addition of personnel dedicated to this activity, so that department requests for examinations citywide are not delayed.

Finally, costs presented in this memorandum do not include any requisite costs that the Fire Department will incur to conduct the activities associated with year round recruiting, testing and selection of Fire Recruit candidates.
