

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS REGARDING THE CONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS WITH NORTH LONG BEACH REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT AREA FUNDS

9 WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Long Beach adopted and
10 approved a certain Redevelopment Plan (the "Redevelopment Plan") for the North Long
11 Beach Redevelopment Project (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the Project and the immediate
neighborhood in which the Project is located, the Redevelopment Agency of the City of
Long Beach, California (the "Agency"), has recognized the need for certain public
improvements, which improvements will be located within the boundaries of the Project,
and proposes to use tax increment funds to finance the improvements; and

WHEREAS, Section 33445 of the California Community Redevelopment
Law (Health and Safety Code Section 33000 <u>et seq</u>.) requires the Agency to make
certain findings prior to the acquisition of land and construction of public improvements
or facilities thereon;

21 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves22 as follows:

Section 1. The City Council determines that the construction of public
improvements, more particularly described in Exhibit "A", are of benefit to the Project
and the immediate neighborhood in which the Project is located. This finding is
supported by the following facts:

Long Beach Boulevard currently suffers from poor paving and other
 road conditions. These factors have diminished the value of property,

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contributed to a negative image of the surrounding neighborhood and serve as a blighting influence to the Project Area. The introduction of public improvements will eliminate blight from the Project Area and cure the community of these adverse conditions.

Sec. 2. The City Council determines that no other reasonable means of financing the above-described improvements are available to the community. This finding is supported by the following facts:

Before the passage of Proposition 13, most of the City's general operating and capital improvements were funded through property taxes. However, the initiative placed severe constraints on the City's ability to use property tax revenues to offset increases in operating and capital costs. It has also been difficult for the City, by itself, to provide sufficient funds to support the construction of major public improvements. In fiscal year 2004-2005, the limited resources of the City's General Fund are committed to previously incurred obligations and planned projects.

16 Sec. 3. The City Council further determines that the payment of funds for the construction of the public improvements will assist in the elimination of one 17 18 or more blighting conditions within the Project, and is consistent with the implementa-19 tion plan adopted pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 33490.

20 Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its 21 adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this 22 resolution.

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
