Subject: Update to Harbor Patrol Authorities

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approve the first reading of the ordinance and authorize the Board of Harbor Commissioners to consolidate existing ordinances and authorize enforcement of additional statutes and municipal codes on the Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle and Pedestrian Path.

DISCUSSION

The Harbor Department Security Division provides security and patrol services to the Harbor Department throughout the Harbor District, within the Port Administration Building (located at 415 W. Ocean Boulevard), and within the underground parking structure associated with the Port Administration Building. On February 27, 2023, the Board of Harbor Commissioners adopted Resolution No. HD-3123 requesting an ordinance from the Long Beach City Council to delegate authority to the Board of Harbor Commissioners to amend and restate existing ordinances, enforce specific statutes, make arrests, and prepare, issue, and deliver written notices within the Harbor District, the Port Administration, the underground parking structure, and on the Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle and Pedestrian Path.

The Board of Harbor Commissioners had previously adopted Ordinance No. HD-1903, amending and restating the authority of the Harbor Department Director of Security, the Chief Port Security Officer, and Harbor Patrol Officers to enforce statutes and ordinances, to arrest and to prepare, issue and deliver written Notices to Appear within the Harbor District of the City of Long Beach, and Ordinance No. HD-2305, which conveys certain authorities outside of the Harbor District at the Port Administration Building. Ordinance No. HD-2397 added authorities and authorized additional jurisdiction to include the parking garage below the Port Administration Building. The attached ordinance would combine these three previous ordinances and add specific authorities related to the Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle and Pedestrian Path and Civic Chambers and shared spaces within City Hall, when Harbor business is underway. The Long Beach Police Department remains the primary law enforcement agency and maintains jurisdiction over the Civic Chambers and shared spaces within City Hall at all times.

The Harbor Department has worked with the California Highway Patrol, City Attorney's Office, Public Works and the Long Beach Police Department to design a comprehensive approach to safety and security for the Mark Memorial Bixby Bicycle and Pedestrian Path and the Long Beach International Gateway Bridge. The Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle and Pedestrian Path and Long Beach International Gateway are secured through a deliberate deployment of cameras, gates, environmental designs, and active patrols.

FISCAL IMPACT

This action has no fiscal impact. The resources to meet the security responsibilities reflected in the updated ordinance are included in the existing Harbor Department operating budget.

SUGGESTED ACTION

Approve recommendation.

RESOLUTION NO. HD- 3123

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF HARBOR
COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH
REQUESTING AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF LONG BEACH AMENDING THE LONG BEACH
MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING AND RESTATING
CHAPTERS 10.48.060, 10.51.050, 10.52.040 and 10.54.040
RELATING TO THE MARK BIXBY MEMORIAL BICYCLE-
PEDESTRIAN PATH

WHEREAS, Section 1203(b) of the Long Beach City Charter provides the Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners the power and duty for and on behalf of the City to operate publicly owned facilities incident to the operation of the Harbor District, both inside and outside of the Harbor District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1203(d) of the Long Beach City Charter, the Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners has the power and duty on behalf of the City to control and have jurisdiction of the Harbor District and “to make and enforce in the Harbor District general rules and regulations, to the extent that may be necessary or requisite for port purposes and harbor development, and in carrying out the powers elsewhere vested in the Commission”; and

WHEREAS, Section 1203(t) of the Long Beach City Charter provides that the Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners has the power and duty “to adopt and enforce such ordinances, orders, regulations, and practices as are necessary for the proper administration and discharge of its duties and powers, or for the management and government of the Harbor District and its facilities”; and

1 WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach, a municipal corporation acting by and through
2 its Board of Harbor Commissioners, has recently constructed the Mark Bixby Memorial
3 Bicycle-Pedestrian Path, a Class 1 Bike Path; and

4 WHEREAS, the Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle-Pedestrian Path connects the
5 bicycle network east of the Los Angeles River, across the connector bridge and over the
6 Long Beach International Gateway Bridge (07-0W150) and, while the bike path has
7 remained closed due to construction activity within the Harbor District, it is anticipated
8 that the bike path will open to the public in the Spring of 2023; and

9 WHEREAS, in anticipation of opening the bike path, representatives from the City
10 of Long Beach and the State of California Department of Transportation met and toured
11 the facility and mutually determined that due to the steep incline of the bridge and the
12 shared space of pedestrians and bicyclists, certain operational and access restrictions
13 are necessary and proper to advance the safety of persons and property, and to
14 safeguard navigational and commercial operations within the Harbor District; and

15 WHEREAS, the proposed operational and access restrictions to the Mark Bixby
16 Memorial Bicycle-Pedestrian Path have been presented to the Board, and the Board has
17 determined the restrictions to be necessary and proper to advance the safety of persons
18 and property, and to safeguard navigational and commercial operations within the Harbor
19 District;

20 WHEREAS, Section 1204 of the Charter of the City of Long Beach empowers the
21 City Council, by ordinance, to confer upon and delegate to the Board of Harbor
22 Commissioners such additional powers and duties which the City Council deems
23 necessary or convenient to carry out the general purposes of the Board of Harbor
24 Commissioners; and

25 NOW, THEREFORE, the Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners
26 requests as follows:

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1 Section 1. That the City Council pursuant to Section 1204 of the Long Beach City
2 Charter amend and restate Chapter 10.48.060 of the Long Beach Municipal Code is
3 hereby amended and restated to read as follows:

4 Chapter 10.48.060

5 PATH USE

6 Whenever a usable path for bicycles has been provided adjacent to a roadway,
7 bicycle riders shall use such path and shall not use the roadway. Notwithstanding the
8 foregoing, no person other than an authorized City employee or representative shall use,
9 or enter upon, that portion of the Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle-Pedestrian Path, including
10 its Ocean Boulevard, Pico Boulevard and Terminal Island approaches, located within the
11 jurisdiction of the City of Long Beach between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.

12 Moreover, in addition to the prohibitions set forth in Chapters 10.51.030, 10.52.040 and
13 10.54.040, the use of scooters on the Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle-Pedestrian Path is
14 prohibited at all times.

15 Section 2. That the City Council pursuant to Section 1204 of the Long Beach City
16 Charter amend and restate Chapter 10.51.050 of the Long Beach Municipal Code is
17 hereby amended and restated to read as follows:

18 Chapter 10.51.050

19 PROHIBITED—AREAS ENUMERATED

20 The City Council, having made a finding that the operation of EMBs on the
21 following streets, alleys or sidewalks, or portion thereof, will create a hazard to persons or
22 property, determines and declares said streets, alleys or sidewalks, or portions thereof,
23 as areas where the operation of EMBs is prohibited:

24 A. East Second Street, between the intersection of Second Street and
25 Livingston Drive and Naples Plaza, including the entire portion of the roadway and the
26 entire width of both the north and south sidewalk, except the entire width of the north
27 sidewalks between the east curb of Bay Shore and San Marco;

28 B. The Belmont Pier Plaza located at the foot of Belmont Pier;

- 1 C. The east-west pedestrian walkway designated as Allin Street between the
2 southerly projection of Thirty-Ninth Place on the west and the southerly projection of
3 Termino Avenue on the east;
- 4 D. The Belmont Pier Plaza parking lot located on the beach southerly of Allin
5 Street between Belmont Pier on the west and the southerly projection of Termino Avenue
6 on the east;
- 7 E. Midway Street between Thirty-Ninth Place on the west and Termino Avenue
8 on the east including the entire portion of the roadway and the entire width of both the
9 north and south sidewalks;
- 10 F. West sidewalk of Termino Avenue between Ocean Boulevard on the north
11 and the westerly projection of the south side of Olympic Plaza on the south;
- 12 G. The sidewalks adjacent to Belmont Plaza Pool on the north, south, east and
13 west sides;
- 14 H. The street and sidewalks at the end of Plaza Way, between Vista del Golfo
15 and Corso di Oro, adjacent to Look-Out Park;
- 16 I. Within the civic center plaza or within Lincoln Park, which together include
17 all areas bounded by the west right-of-way line of Pacific Avenue, the north right-of-way
18 line of Ocean Boulevard, the west right-of-way line of the vacated Chestnut Avenue right-
19 of-way, and the south right-of-way line of Broadway;
- 20 J. Within all areas known as The Promenade South and The Promenade
21 North, between Shoreline Drive and Third Street, including the bridges over Seaside Way
22 and Shoreline Drive, and the plaza areas surrounding the children's fountain;
- 23 K. Within all portions of the Long Beach Convention and Entertainment Center
24 site, including sidewalks, other pedestrian assembly areas, driving aisles, parking lots
25 and parking structures;
- 26 L. South side of Fourth Street between Cherry Avenue and Junipero Avenue
27 and the north side of Fourth Street between Cherry Avenue and Rose Place;
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1 M. That portion of both sides of the street and sidewalks of Thirty-First Street
2 between Atlantic Avenue and Long Beach Boulevard;

3 N. Both sides of Fourth Street between Ximeno Avenue and Park Avenue;

4 O. That portion of the Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle-Pedestrian Path, including
5 its Ocean Boulevard, Pico Boulevard and Terminal Island approaches, located within the
6 jurisdiction of the City of Long Beach.

7 Section 3. That the City Council pursuant to Section 1204 of the Long Beach City
8 Charter amend and restate Chapter 10.52.040 of the Long Beach Municipal Code is
9 hereby amended and restated to read as follows:

10 Chapter 10.52.040

11 PROHIBITED—AREAS ENUMERATED

12 The City Council, having made a finding that rollerskating on the following streets,
13 alleys or sidewalks, or portions thereof, creates a danger and hazard to persons or
14 property, determines and declares said streets, alleys or sidewalks, or portion thereof, as
15 areas where rollerskating is prohibited:

16 A. East Second Street, between the intersection of Second Street and
17 Livingston Drive and Naples Plaza, including the entire portion of the roadway and the
18 entire width of both the north and south sidewalk, except the entire width of the north
19 sidewalks between the east curb of Bay Shore and San Marco;

20 B. The Belmont pier plaza located at the foot of Belmont pier;

21 C. The east-west pedestrian walkway designated as Allin Street between the
22 southerly projection of Thirty-Ninth Place on the west and the southerly projection of
23 Termino Avenue on the east;

24 D. The Belmont pier plaza parking lot located on the beach southerly of Allin
25 Street between Belmont pier on the west and the southerly projection of Termino Avenue
26 on the east;

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- 1 E. Midway Street between Thirty-Ninth Place on the west and Termino Avenue
2 on the east including the entire portion of the roadway and the entire width of both the
3 north and south sidewalks;
- 4 F. West sidewalk of Termino Avenue between Ocean Boulevard on the north
5 and the westerly projection of the south side of Olympic Plaza on the south;
- 6 G. Repealed;
- 7 H. The sidewalks adjacent to Belmont plaza pool on the north, south, east and
8 west sides;
- 9 I. The street and sidewalks at the end of Plaza Way, between Vista del Golfo
10 and Corso di Oro, adjacent to Look-out park;
- 11 J. Within the civic center plaza or within Lincoln park, which together include
12 all areas bounded by the west right-of-way line of Pacific Avenue, the north right-of-way
13 line of Ocean Boulevard, the west right-of-way line of the vacated Chestnut Avenue right-
14 of-way, and the south right-of-way line of Broadway;
- 15 K. Within all areas known as The Promenade South and The Promenade
16 North, between Shoreline Drive and Third Street, including the bridges over Seaside Way
17 and Shoreline Drive, and the plaza areas surrounding the children's fountain;
- 18 L. Within all portions of the Long Beach Convention and Entertainment Center
19 site, including sidewalks, other pedestrian assembly areas, driving aisles, parking lots
20 and parking structures;
- 21 M. South side of Fourth Street between Cherry Avenue and Junipero Avenue
22 and the north side of Fourth Street between Cherry Avenue and Rose Place;
- 23 N. That portion of both sides of the street and sidewalks of Thirty-First Street
24 between Atlantic Avenue and Long Beach Boulevard;
- 25 O. Both sides of Fourth Street between Ximeno Avenue and Park Avenue;
- 26 P. That portion of the Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle-Pedestrian Path, including
27 its Ocean Boulevard, Pico Boulevard and Terminal Island approaches, located within the
28 jurisdiction of the City of Long Beach.

1 Section 4. That the City Council pursuant to Section 1204 of the Long Beach City
2 Charter amend and restate Chapter 10.54.040 of the Long Beach Municipal Code is
3 hereby amended and restated to read as follows:

4 Chapter 10.54.040

5 PROHIBITED—AREAS ENUMERATED

6 The City Council, having made a finding that the operation of skateboards on the
7 following streets, alleys or sidewalks, or portion thereof, will create a hazard to persons or
8 property, determines and declares said streets, alleys or sidewalks, or portions thereof,
9 as areas where the operation of skateboards is prohibited:

- 10 A. All streets, alleys and sidewalks in an area bounded by and including Vista
11 Street on the north, Nieto Avenue on the east, East Broadway on the south and Park
12 Avenue on the west;
- 13 B. The pedestrian overpass located on Carson Street, east of Faculty Avenue;
- 14 C. That portion of the streets and sidewalks of Pine Avenue located between
15 Eighth Street and Shoreline Drive;
- 16 D. That portion of the street and sidewalks of Shoreline Drive located between
17 Ocean Boulevard and Linden Avenue;
- 18 E. That portion of the street and sidewalks of Junipero Avenue located south
19 of Ocean Boulevard;
- 20 F. That portion of the street and sidewalks of Manila Avenue located between
21 Pacific Coast Highway and Colorado Street;
- 22 G. That portion of the north-south alley between Ultimo Avenue and Flint
23 Avenue located south of Fourth Street;
- 24 H. That portion of the street and sidewalks of East Second Street located
25 between Quincy Avenue and Bay Shore Avenue;
- 26 I. That portion of the street and sidewalks of Wilton Street located east of
27 Termino Avenue;
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- 1 J. The bridge located on Neapolitan Lane West crossing over the Naples
2 Canal and the bridges located on the Toledo Street, Ravenna Drive and Neapolitan Lane
3 East, all crossing over the Rivo Alto Canal;
- 4 K. That portion of the street and sidewalks of Flint Avenue located between
5 Fourth Street and Colorado Street, and that portion of north-south alley between Flint
6 Avenue and Winslow Avenue located between Fourth Street and Colorado Street;
- 7 L. That portion of the street and sidewalks of Shaw Street located between
8 Quincy Avenue and Roycroft Avenue, and that portion of the north-south alley between
9 Quincy Avenue and Roycroft Avenue located between East Broadway Avenue and
10 Livingston Drive;
- 11 M. All streets, alleys and sidewalks in an area bounded by and including Shaw
12 Street on the north, Ximeno Avenue on the east, the north sidewalk of Livingston Drive
13 on the south and Belmont Avenue on the west; except Bennett Avenue between Second
14 Street and Shaw Street;
- 15 N. All streets, alleys and sidewalks in an area bounded by and including East
16 Broadway Street on the north, Quincy Avenue on the east, the north sidewalk of
17 Livingston Drive on the south, and Ximeno Avenue on the west;
- 18 O. That portion of the street and sidewalks of Sixty-Second Place between
19 Seaside Walk and Ocean Boulevard;
- 20 P. That portion of the north-south alley between First Street and Second
21 Street, and east of Termino Avenue;
- 22 Q. The Belmont Pier Plaza located at the foot of Belmont Pier;
- 23 R. The east-west pedestrian walkway designated as Allin Street between the
24 southerly projection of Thirty-Ninth Place on the west and the southerly projection of
25 Termino Avenue on the east;
- 26 S. The Belmont Pier Plaza parking lot located on the beach southerly of Allin
27 Street between Belmont Pier on the west and the southerly projection of Termino Avenue
28 on the east;

- 1 T. Midway Street between Thirty-Ninth Place on the west and Termino Avenue
2 on the east including the entire portion of the roadway and the entire width of both the
3 north and south sidewalks;
- 4 U. West sidewalk of Termino Avenue between Ocean Boulevard on the north
5 and the westerly projection of the south side of Olympic Plaza on the south;
- 6 V. That portion of the sidewalks of Pine Avenue and Tenth Street adjacent to
7 the senior citizen's residential development known as Baptist Gardens, the address of
8 which is 1011 Pine Avenue;
- 9 W. All streets and sidewalks within the area south of Ocean Boulevard
10 between the Long Beach Museum of Art on the west and the Taper property on the east,
11 known as Bluff Park;
- 12 X. The bicycle path located on granted tide and submerged lands commencing
13 at the Los Angeles River and running in an easterly direction at or adjacent to the waters
14 of the Pacific Ocean;
- 15 Y. Roycroft Avenue, between the intersection of Fourth Street and Colorado
16 Street, including the entire portion of the roadway and the entire width of both the east
17 and west sidewalk;
- 18 Z. Third Street, between the intersection of Argonne Avenue and Granada
19 Avenue, including the entire portion of the roadway and the entire width of both the north
20 and south sidewalk;
- 21 AA. South sidewalk of Seventh Street, between Temple Avenue and Redondo
22 Avenue;
- 23 BB. The sidewalks adjacent to Belmont Plaza pool on the north, south, east and
24 west sides;
- 25 CC. The street and sidewalks at the end of Plaza Way, between Vista del Golfo
26 and Corso di Oro, adjacent to Look-Out Park;
- 27 DD. Quincy Avenue between Third Street and Broadway, including the entire
28 portion of the roadway and the entire width of both the east and west sidewalks;

1 EE. Within the Civic Center Plaza or within Lincoln Park, which together include
2 all areas bounded by the west right-of-way line of Pacific Avenue, the north right-of-way
3 line of Ocean Boulevard, the west right-of-way line of the vacated Chestnut Avenue right-
4 of-way, and the south right-of-way line of Broadway;

5 FF. Within all areas known as The Promenade South and The Promenade
6 North, between Shoreline Drive and Third Street, including the bridges over Seaside Way
7 and Shoreline Drive, and the plaza area surrounding the children's fountain;

8 GG. Within all portions of the Long Beach Convention and Entertainment Center
9 site, including sidewalks, other pedestrian assembly areas, driving aisles, parking lots
10 and parking structures;

11 HH. South side of Fourth Street between Cherry Avenue and Junipero Avenue
12 and the north side of Fourth Street between Cherry Avenue and Rose Place;

13 II. That portion of both sides of the street and sidewalks of Thirty-First Street
14 between Atlantic Avenue and Long Beach Boulevard;

15 JJ. Both sides of Fourth Street between Ximeno Avenue and Park Avenue;

16 KK. That portion of the Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle-Pedestrian Path, including
17 its Ocean Boulevard, Pico Boulevard and Terminal Island approaches, located within the
18 jurisdiction of the City of Long Beach.

19 Section 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the
20 Board of Harbor Commissioners, and the Secretary of the Board shall certify to the vote
21 adopting this resolution and shall cause a certified copy of this resolution to be filed forth
22 with the City Clerk. The City Clerk shall post the resolution in three (3) conspicuous
23 places in the City of Long Beach.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH CONFERRING UPON AND DELEGATING TO THE BOARD OF HARBOR COMMISSIONERS THE AUTHORITY TO ENFORCE STATUTES AND ORDINANCES, TO ARREST AND TO PREPARE, ISSUE, AND DELIVER WRITTEN NOTICES TO APPEAR INSIDE THE CITY OF LONG BEACH HARBOR DISTRICT, INCLUDING AT THE MARK BIXBY MEMORIAL BICYCLE-PEDESTRIAN PATH, AT THE PORT ADMINISTRATION BUILDING AND THE ASSOCIATED UNDERGROUND PARKING STRUCTURE, AND AT OTHER SPECIFIC PREMISES OUTSIDE THE HARBOR DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Section 1203(b) of the Long Beach City Charter provides the Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners the power and duty for and on behalf of the City to operate publicly owned facilities incident to the operation of the Harbor District, both inside and outside of the Harbor District; and

WHEREAS, the Harbor Department is headquartered at 415 W. Ocean Boulevard in Long Beach ("Port Administration Building"), which is part of the Civic Center Plaza, and has an associated underground parking structure ("parking structure"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach, a municipal corporation acting by and through its Board of Harbor Commissioners, has recently completed construction of the Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle-Pedestrian Path, a Class 1 Bike Path; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1203(d) of the Long Beach City Charter, the Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners has the power and duty on behalf of the City to control and have jurisdiction of the Harbor District and "to make and enforce in the Harbor

1 District general rules and regulations, to the extent that may be necessary or requisite for
2 port purposes and harbor development, and in carrying out the powers elsewhere vested
3 in the Commission”; and

4 WHEREAS, Section 1203(t) of the Long Beach City Charter provides that the
5 Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners has the power and duty “[t]o adopt and
6 enforce such ordinances, orders, regulations, and practices as are necessary for the proper

17 deliver written Notices to Appear outside of the Harbor District at the Port Administration
18 Building and the associated parking structure, in addition to several other areas at the Civic
19 Center Plaza; and

20 WHEREAS, the Board of Harbor Commissioners adopted Ordinance No.
21 HD-2397, which amended Ordinance No. HD-1903 and Ordinance No. HD-2305, to
22 authorize designated officers of the Harbor Department Security Division to have additional
23 authority to enforce statutes and ordinances, to arrest and to prepare, issue and deliver
24 written Notices to Appear within the Harbor District and at the Port Administration Building
25 and the associated parking structure; and

26 WHEREAS, the Board of Harbor Commissioners desires to amend and
27 restate the authorities adopted in Ordinances Nos. HD-1903, HD-2305, and HD-2397; and

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1 WHEREAS, the Board of Harbor Commissioners desires the assistance of
2 the Harbor Department Security Division to enforce statutes and ordinances, and to arrest
3 and to prepare, issue and deliver written notices to appear within the Harbor District,
4 including at those portions of the Mark Bixby Memorial Bicycle-Pedestrian Path including
5 its Ocean Boulevard, Pico Boulevard and Terminal Island approaches.

6 NOW THEREFORE, The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as
7 follows:

8 Section 1. The City Council of the City of Long Beach (“City Council”),
9 pursuant to Section 1204 of the Charter of the City of Long Beach, confers upon and

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

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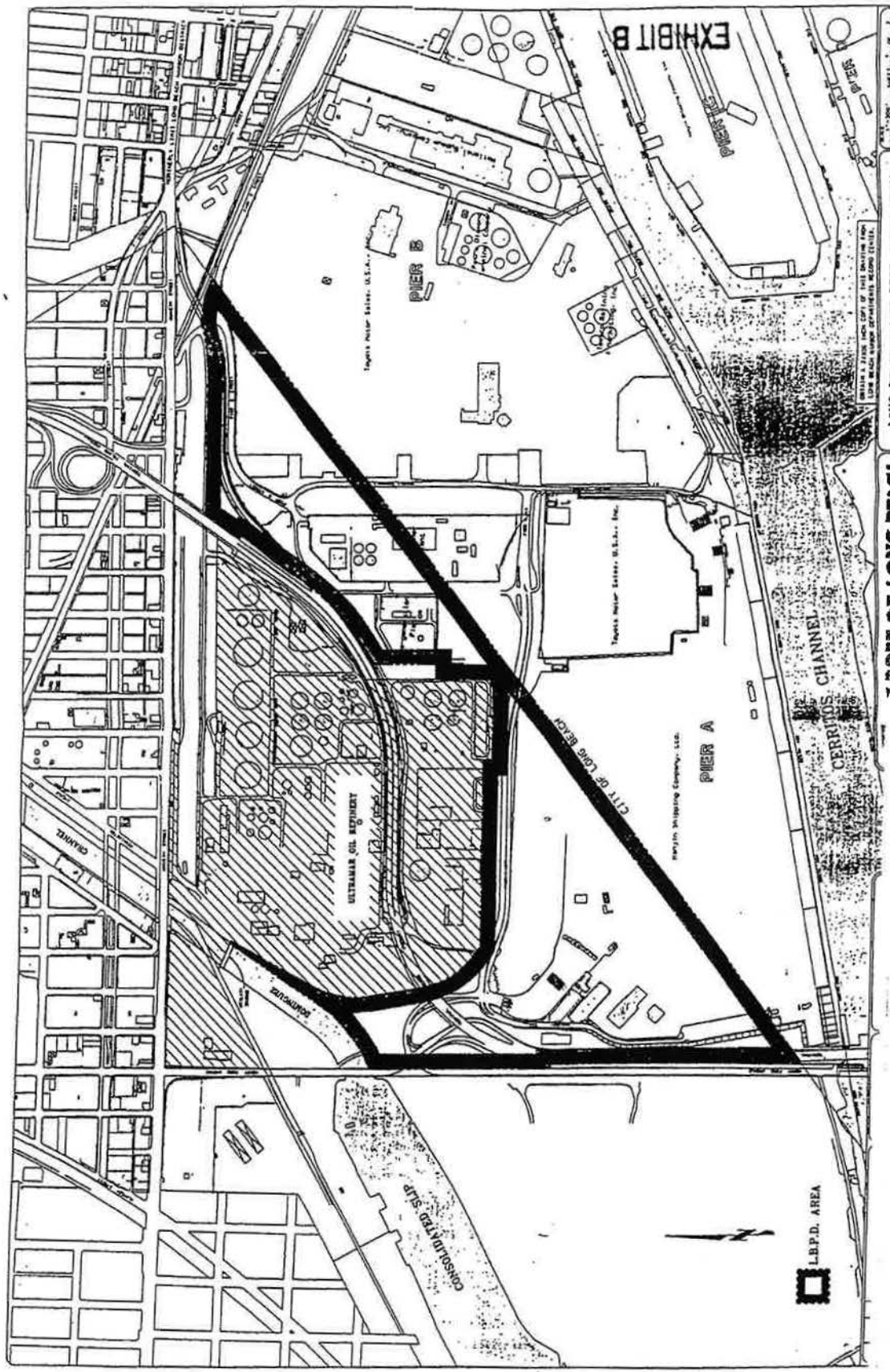

25 entrances is limited to authorized persons and vehicles and to direct traffic on Magnolia

28 Notice to Appear in court.

10 officers or safety members or classes of peace officers or safety members for purposes
11 of retirement, workmen's compensation or similar injury or death benefits or any other
12 employee benefit or benefits to which said employee would not have been entitled as a
13 public employee prior to the adoption of this ordinance.

14 Sec. 6. Except as set forth in this ordinance, Ordinance No. HD-1903
15 remains unchanged and in full force and effect.

16 Sec. 7. It is the intention of the Board of Harbor Commissioners of the City
17 of Long Beach that this ordinance and every provision hereof shall be considered
18 separable; and the invalidity of any section, clause, or provision, or part or portion of any
19 section, clause or provision of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other
20 portion of this ordinance.







17 WHEREAS, the Harbor Department is headquartered at 415 W. Ocean

20 WHEREAS, the Executive Director of the Long Beach Harbor Department
21 has determined that it is necessary for its Director of Security, Chief Port Security Officer
22 and Harbor Patrol Officers to have clearly defined authority to enforce certain statutes and
23 ordinances, to arrest, and to prepare, issue and deliver written Notices to Appear within
24 the City of Long Beach Harbor District ("Harbor District"), at the Port Administration
25 Building, and at the parking structure; and

26 WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. ORD-22-0038, the City Council of
27 the City of Long Beach conferred upon and delegated to the Board of Harbor
28 Commissioners the ability to amend Ordinance No. HD-1903, as it may be amended or

1 replaced from time to time, to allow the Harbor Department Director of Security, the Chief
2 Port Security Officer, and Harbor Patrol Officers to have clearly defined authority to enforce
3 certain statutes and ordinances, to arrest, and to prepare, issue and deliver written Notices
4 to Appear within the Harbor District, at the Port Administration Building, and at the parking
5 structure; and

6 WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. HD-3117, the Board of Harbor
7 Commissioners of the City of Long Beach approved the conferred and delegated powers
8 as set forth in Ordinance No. HD-2397; and

9 WHEREAS, the Director of Environmental Planning of the Long Beach
10 Harbor Department has determined, in a review of the applicability of the California
11 Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") to said amended grant of enforcement authority, that
12 such grant will not result in a direct physical change in the environment or a reasonably
13 foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment and that, pursuant to the
14 provisions of CEQA and the State Guidelines implementing CEQA, such grant is not
15 subject to the provisions of CEQA.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Harbor Commissioners of the City of Long

18 Sec. 1. The Board hereby finds and determines that the following grant of
19 authority will not result in a direct physical change in the environment or a reasonably
20 foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment and is therefore not subject to the
21 provisions of CEQA.

22 Sec. 2. The Board hereby finds and determines that the Harbor Department
23 Director of Security, Chief Port Security Officer and Harbor Patrol Officers are hereby
24 authorized to enforce the following provisions within the Harbor District, at the Port
25 Administration Building, and within the parking structure (including loading docks and
26 ramps), and are authorized, pursuant to California Penal Code Section 836.5, to arrest
27 persons and to prepare, issue and deliver to any arrested person a written Notice to Appear
28 in court and to release such person from custody upon receiving from him his written

1 promise to appear in court for any violation or violations of any provisions enumerated
2 herein:

3 California Vehicle Code Sections 21211(B) (no parking in bike lane),
4 21960 (restricting use of freeways by pedestrians and bicyclists), 21961
5 (restricting pedestrians' crossing of roadways to crosswalks), 22500(L)
6 (parking front of curb cut out access ramp), 22502(B) (parking the wrong
7 way), 22507.8 (improperly parking in spaces designated for persons with
8 disabilities), 22511 (electric vehicles), 22511.1 (electric vehicles not
9 charging), 22511.8 (parking for persons with disabilities), 22520 (parking on
10 a freeway), 22652 (removal of vehicles improperly parked in spaces
11 designated for persons with disabilities), and 38320(A) (littering and
12 environmental protection); and

13 California Penal Code Section 537 (defrauding an innkeeper); and

14 Long Beach Municipal Code Sections 5.60 (special event permit
15 required), 6.16.100 (dog leash required), 6.16.110 (dog noise prohibited),

The Secretary shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by the Board, shall cause the same to be posted in three (3) conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach, and shall cause a certified copy of this ordinance to be filed forthwith with the City Clerk. This ordinance shall take effect on the 31st day after its final passage.
