

CITY OF LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA,  
REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE  
COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES TO CONSOLIDATE A  
GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON  
NOVEMBER 3, 2020 WITH THE STATEWIDE GENERAL  
ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THAT DATE PURSUANT TO  
§10403 OF THE ELECTIONS CODE

WHEREAS, on July 29, 2020, the City Council of the City of Long Beach  
called a General Municipal Election to be held on November 3, 2020 for the purpose of  
submitting to the voters the question relating to an increase in the City's general purpose  
Oil Barrel Production (Barrel) Tax, by fifteen cents, from fifteen cents per barrel to a  
maximum of thirty cents per barrel; and

WHEREAS, it is therefore desirable that the General Municipal Election be  
consolidated with the Statewide General Election to be held on the same date and that  
within the City the precincts, polling places and election officers of the two elections be  
the same, and that the election department of the County of Los Angeles canvass the  
returns of the General Municipal Election and that the election be held in all respects as if  
there were only one election;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as  
follows:

Section 1. Request for Consolidation. Pursuant to the requirements of  
§10403 of the Elections Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles is  
hereby requested to consent and agree to the consolidation of a General Municipal  
Election with the Statewide General Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, for the  
purpose of submitting to the voters the following question relating to the amendment to

1 the City's general purpose Oil Barrel Production (Barrel) Tax in Long Beach Municipal  
2 Code Section 3.80.221, from fifteen cents per barrel to a maximum of thirty cents per  
3 barrel.

4 Section 2. Measure Language. A measure is to appear on the ballot as  
5 follows:

<b>"LONG BEACH COMMUNITY SERVICES GENERAL PURPOSE OIL PRODUCTION TAX INCREASE MEASURE.</b> To provide funding for community healthcare services; air/water quality and climate change programs; increase childhood education/ youth programs; expand job training opportunities; and maintain other general fund programs, shall a measure be adopted increasing Long Beach's general oil production tax from 15¢ to maximum 30¢ per barrel, subject to annual adjustments, generating approximately \$1,600,000 annually, until ended by voters, requiring audits/ local control of funds?" 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13 Section 3. Canvass of Returns. The County election department is  
14 authorized to canvass the returns and perform all other proceedings incidental to and  
15 connected with the General Municipal Election. The Election shall be held in all respects  
16 as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used. Pursuant to  
17 California Elections Code Sections 10403 and 10418, the election will be held and  
18 conducted in accordance with the provisions of law regulating the Statewide General  
19 Election.

20 Section 4. Necessary Steps. The Board of Supervisors is requested to  
21 issue instructions to the County election department to take any and all steps necessary  
22 for the holding of the consolidated election.

23 Section 5. Costs. The City Council determines and declares that the City  
24 will pay to the County the reasonable and actual expenses incurred by the County by the  
25 consolidation of the General Municipal Election with the Statewide General Election. The  
26 City shall reimburse the County for services performed when the work is completed and  
27 upon presentation to the City of a properly approved bill. The City Manager of the City of  
28 Long Beach is authorized and directed to pay for the expenses incurred after receiving a

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1 statement from the County of Los Angeles.

2 Section 6. Filing of Resolution. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file a  
3 certified copy of this resolution with the Board of Supervisors and the election department  
4 of the County of Los Angeles.

5 Section 7. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its  
6 adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this  
7 Resolution.
