### RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the City Manager to execute all necessary documents to receive and expend grant funding from the NIJ FY09 Paul Coverdell Forensic Sciences Improvement Grant Program and increase appropriations in the General Grants Fund (SR) and in the Police Department (PD) by \$125,000. (Citywide)

# DISCUSSION

The City of Long Beach Police Department was recently awarded grant funding from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, National Institute of Justice, for the NIJ FY09 Paul Coverdell Forensic Sciences Improvement Grant Program (Coverdell 09 NIJ) for \$125,000. The grant monies will be used for overtime and laboratory equipment to improve the quality and timeliness of forensic science services and to eliminate backlogs in the analysis of forensic evidence, including controlled substances, firearms examination, forensic pathology, latent prints, questioned documents, toxicology, and trace evidence.

Deputy City Attorney Gary Anderson reviewed this item on September 15, 2009 and Budget and Performance Management Bureau Manager David Wodynski reviewed this item on September 18, 2009.

#### TIMING CONSIDERATIONS
