


Harbor Fund


- State Tideland Grant to the City of Long Beach in 1911
- Manage and Develop the Harbor District for the trust purposes of commerce, navigation, fisheries, and recreation for the benefit of the citizens of California.
- Harbor District, Board of Harbor Commissioners, and Harbor Department created by amendment to the Long Beach City Charter in 1931
- Provide for the needs of commerce, navigation, recreation, and fisheries in the Harbor District.
- The use of Harbor Fund is therefore governed Long Beach City Charter. under both the State Tideland's Grant and the

Tideland Operating Fund (TOF) Transfers from the Harbor Department to the

- Upon City Council resolution by a vote of twothirds on an annual basis
- Amount of transfer shall not exceed 10% of net statement income on most recently audited financial
- Subject to prior approval of majority of Board of Harbor Commissioners
- Resolution by Board of Harbor Commissioners Department operations that funds will not be needed for Harbor
