3 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
4 CITY OF LONG BEACH SUPPORTING THE STATE OF
5 URBAN MANUFACTURING REPORT

7 WHEREAS, the State of Urban Manufacturing (“SUM”) report will be a
8 comprehensive workforce and industrial development study across various United States
9 cities, highlighting the current state of manufacturing in an effort towards sustaining and
10 growing manufacturing in cities; and

11 WHEREAS, the SUM report will provide a baseline on the current state of
12 manufacturing in pilot cities to better understand how to improve and scale
13 manufacturing; and

14 WHEREAS, participating pilot cities will have the opportunity to coordinate
15 with one another and have their work showcased on a national stage; and

16 WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach has been identified as a potential pilot
17 city for the study; and

18 WHEREAS, the leader of the study is the Urban Manufacturing Alliance
19 (“UMA”), a national non-profit organization with approximately five hundred organizations
20 and city partners who are focused on revitalizing manufacturing in metropolitan hubs; and

21 WHEREAS, Long Beach-based Localism, Inc. is the local community
22 partner for this national project and will implement the study along with community and
23 industry partners; and

24 WHEREAS, Esri has partnered to integrate the study's geo-data into the
25 new DataLB open data portal; and

26 WHEREAS, the SUM report will begin with a profile of current
27 manufacturing based on current datasets and a literature review, and the second phase
28 will provide insights into manufacturing based on primary data collection in partnership

1 with UMA member cities;

2 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as
3 follows:

4 Section 1. The City hereby agrees to support the SUM report as a
5 convening partner in an effort to cultivate industrial and workforce development in Long
6 Beach.

7 Section 2. The City hereby requests the SUM report be performed by the
8 Urban Manufacturing Alliance (UMA) in collaboration with Localism, Inc.

9 Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption
10 by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
