RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation to declare Ordinance amending Section 16.08.460 of the Long Beach Municipal Code, related to fishing restrictions on the banks of the Los Angeles River, read the first time and laid over to the next regular meeting of the City Council for final reading. (District 2)

DISCUSSION

The City of Long Beach provides and maintains five fishing piers along the channel between the downtown shore area and the Port of Long Beach property for the purpose of free public recreational fishing (attachment). The piers are provided to afford a fishing area so that the perimeter rocks on the riverbanks will not be used for this purpose. Fishing from the perimeter rocks is hazardous, and trash and bait that is left behind attracts rodents. Additionally, the City has been receiving complaints from the hotel operators on the west shore of the river concerning the trash and debris that has been left on site. The City's Municipal Code does not currently prohibit fishing from the perimeter rocks, and this action will rectify that oversight.

The proposed Municipal Code change is to add the following to Section 16.08.460:

K. Banks of the Los Angeles River, south of Ocean Boulevard, with the exception of the fishing piers.

Once the Ordinance is passed, the Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine will install signage as part of its regular sign program. Enforcement will be carried out as part of the normal patrol by the Police Department, which will also respond to complaints, if received.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Gary J. Anderson on February 25, 2010, and September 30, 2010, and Budget Management Officer Victoria Bell on March 9, 2010.

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TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on May 18, 2010, in order to incorporate this addition to the Long Beach Municipal Code.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact associated with this request. There is no known impact to local jobs associated with this request.
