#### **DIRECT GRANTS PROGRAM**

The City of Long Beach Direct Grants Program provides financial assistance to eligible equity applicants and equity businesses to gain entry into, and successfully operate in, the regulated cannabis marketplace. The purpose of direct grants is to offset non-City costs associated with completing each phase of the cannabis business license application and permitting process.

#### **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

To participate in the direct grants program, the following eligibility requirements must be met:

- Qualify as an Equity Applicant To qualify as an Equity Applicant, you must have received a Cannabis Social Equity Program Verification Letter issued by the Office of Cannabis Oversight (OCO). For more information on how to qualify, please click here.
- Qualify as an Equity Business To qualify as an Equity Business, you must have submitted an adultuse cannabis business license application to the City and received a Verification of Equity Business Status Letter issued by the Business License Division. For more information on how to qualify, please click here.

#### CANNABIS BUSINESS LICENSING DIRECT GRANT MILESTONES

Equity Applicants and Equity Businesses who complete the following cannabis business licensing direct grant milestones are eligible to receive the grant amounts associated with each milestone.

Direct grants funding has been made available through the State of California, Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz). The requirements to qualify for each milestone and/or grant amount may vary.

The City of Long Beach reserves the right to adjust or change direct grant milestones and grant amounts at any time to ensure that grant funds are continuously available in the areas that need it the most. Any changes to the grant milestones, GO-Biz amounts available will be posted in the 'Important Updates' section of this webpage.





# **Direct Grants Program Update**

The Office of Cannabis Oversight is pleased to announce the recently updated Cannabis Equity Direct Grants Program! The new grants program is designed to give more equity applicants the opportunity to enter the licensing process through an equitable and sustainable distribution of funds.

Under the new Direct Grants Program, equity applicants are eligible to receive funding to help secure a location for their cannabis business prior to entering the licensing process, with supplemental funding available throughout the licensing process. Grants will be awarded based upon business activity and size, specific location and zoning requirements, and the equity applicants' readiness to open a cannabis business in the City of Long Beach.

# Equity Dispensary Ordinance City Council Meeting Recap May 10th, 2022

The Office of Cannabis Oversight presented an ordinance to the City Council to allow up to 8 new equity dispensary businesses in the City of Long Beach on Tuesday. In addition to the dispensary licensing process, the ordinance introduced other changes to the equity program.

At the meeting, the City Council made some amendments to the proposed ordinance including:

- Restricting the equity dispensary RFP process to equity applicants verified on or before May 10, 2022;
- Giving priority to equity applicants that were awarded to move forward in the dispensary process in the 2010 and 2017 lotteries; and,
- Requiring equity businesses to maintain equity ownership for a period of ten years before they can transfer a license to a non-equity individual.

The City Council will review the amended ordinance at its next meeting on May 17th at 5:00 pm.

#### **Direct Technical Assistance News**

New One-on-One Advisory Service for Equity Applicants

In November 2021, the City of Long Beach launched its One-on-One Advisory Services for equity applicants as part of the Cannabis Social Equity Program.

Qualified equity applicants can receive free direct technical assistance from business and financial planning experts to assist with starting their cannabis business.

Starting May 2022 equity applicants can now receive legal support from a new consultant <u>Stone Law Firm</u>, <u>PC</u>. Ashleigh Stone, is a business attorney and the founder of Stone Law Firm, PC, which was created to empower business owners to grow and protect their businesses. Stone Law Firm, PC provides an umbrella of legal services with a focus on properly formed businesses, well-drafted contracts, fair lease agreements, brand protection with trademarks, and best HR practices.

Eligible firms or individuals are encouraged to submit


proposals through the City's Vendor Portal, <u>PlanetBids</u>, by **11:00 a.m. on May 20, 2022**.

\*Per City Attorney guidance, current equity applicants may submit a proposal, but if the equity applicant is selected as a contractor, then contractor shall be required to terminate its equity applicant status, application, and any benefits received in connection therewith, until after completion of the term of the contractor's agreement with the City.
