#### RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH IN SUPPORT OF "BUSINESS FRIENDLY PRINCIPLES" AS PART OF SCAG'S DEVELOPMENT OF A SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA ECONOMIC GROWTH STRATEGY

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach is a member of the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) who is engaged in the development of a Southern California Economic Growth Strategy;

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach supports working with SCAG and other key economic stakeholders to improve the Southern California economy;

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach is a business friendly municipality and has numerous practices in place to encourage economic growth within its community;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section. 1. The City of Long Beach supports the following "Business Friendly Principles" as part of SCAG's development of a Southern California Economic Growth Strategy:

## Principle One - Economic Development as a Priority

The City of Long Beach strives to demonstrate commitment to economic development through its support of Business Improvement Districts (BIDs) and shopping corridors to provide targeted business assistance, by providing a preference to Long Beach businesses when bidding on City contracts and by providing business loans and technical assistance through the Small Business Development Center (SBDC).

## <u>Principle Two – Business Partnership</u>

The City of Long Beach strives to provide quality municipal services to

attract and retain businesses and employees through the administration of the Long Beach Enterprise Zone to provide substantial tax credits to Long Beach businesses, through its Workforce Development programs to provide assistance with employee recruitment and training and through its support of international trade.

## Principle Three - Business Responsive Processes

The City of Long Beach strives to communicate effectively with businesses that are seeking or doing business with the City including providing immediate access to bid notices through "Bids Online," through the establishment of Red Teams to respond quickly to changing economic climates, and through a variety of methods to promote Long Beach as a great location for businesses.

## Principle Four - Attractiveness to Business Investment

The City of Long Beach strives to streamline operations for efficient and responsive business assistance in areas of licensing, permitting, inspections and other municipal services and will seek to improve its attractiveness to new and existing businesses within its jurisdiction including one-stop permitting through its Development Services Center, striving to maintain competitive taxes and fees, and providing expedited permitting process.

Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to submit a copy of this resolution to SCAG in support of SCAG's Regional Economic Summit.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
