Dear Anita:

Following correspondence with Mandy Huffman, Environmental Planner, Wastewater Planning from Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts on August 30, 2022. The following correction was made to the Century Villages at Cabrillo Specific Plan Final EIR at page 3-6 and Draft EIR at page 5.16-10. This change was made because JWPCP does not produce any recycled water. This change does not constitute significant new information that requires recirculation of the DEIR for further public comment under CEQA Guidelines Section 15088.5.

Page 5.16-10, Section 5.16, *Utilities and Service Systems*. The following text is modified in response to Comment A2-2 from the Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts.

Water Supply

LBWD provides water service to residents, businesses, and other users in the City, including the Plan Area. As of 2017, the LBWD's service area encompassed approximately 50 square miles and a population of 480,173, with some customers outside the City limits (LBWD 2017b). The primary source of water is groundwater extracted locally from the Central Basin. According to the Long Beach Water 2020 Urban Water Management Plan, other water supplies include purchased imported water from the Metropolitan Water District (MWD) and recycled water from the Long Beach WRP JWPCP.
