Subject:	Update to Harbor Patrol Authorities

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approve the first reading of the ordinance and authorize the Board of Harbor Commissioners to amend Ordinance No. HD-1903 to address security needs on the Long Beach International Gateway Bridge, Mark Bixby Bike Path, Pier J Bike Path, and within the parking structure associated with the Port Administration Building, and approve the first reading of the ordinance.

DISCUSSION

The Harbor Department Security Division provides security and patrol services to the Harbor Department throughout the Harbor District, the Port Administration Building (located at 415 W. Ocean Boulevard), and the parking structure associated with the Port Administration Building. On September 12, 2022, the Board of Harbor Commissioners adopted Resolution No. HD-3104 requesting an ordinance from the Long Beach City Council to delegate authority to the Board of Harbor Commissioners to amend Ordinance HD-1903 authorizing enforcement of statutes and ordinances within the Harbor District and specified locations outside of the Harbor District.

The Board of Harbor Commissioners had previously adopted Ordinance No. HD-1903, amending and restating the authority of the Harbor Department Director of Security, the Chief Port Security Officer, and Harbor Patrol Officers to enforce statutes and ordinances, to arrest and to prepare, issue and deliver written Notices to Appear within the Harbor District of the City of Long Beach, and Ordinance No. HD-2305, which conveys the same authorities outside of the Harbor District at the Port Administration Building and the parking structure, in addition to several other areas at the Civic Center Plaza. In order to address current security needs, Ordinance No. HD-1903 needs to be amended to include the Long Beach International Gateway Bridge, Mark Bixby Bike Path, and Pier J Bike Path and Fishing area. This amendment will enable the Security Division to provide effective security within these updated areas of the Harbor Department. The amendment will also allow the Security Division to exercise these updated authorities within the parking structure associated with the Port Administration Building.

The Security Division has worked with the City Attorney's Office and the Long Beach Police Department to design a comprehensive approach to security for the Port Administration Building, at the parking structure associated with the Port Administration Building, and throughout the Harbor District. The Port Administration Building and Harbor District are secured through a deliberate deployment of cameras, barriers, environmental designs, and active patrols by the Long Beach Harbor Patrol and Long Beach Police Department. The Ordinance will allow the Director of Security, Chief Port Security Officer, and Harbor Patrol Officers to enforce key sections of the California Penal and Vehicle Codes and Long Beach Municipal Code necessary to protect the Port employees, customers, and other visitors at the Port Administration Building, the associated parking structure, and throughout the Harbor District. Harbor Patrol Officers will patrol and respond to incidents within these specified locations.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on November 15, 2022 to further ongoing discussions with the California Highway Patrol regarding roles and responsibilities on the Long Beach International Gateway Bridge.

FISCAL IMPACT

This action has no fiscal impact. The resources to meet the security responsibilities reflected in the updated ordinance are included in the existing Harbor Department operating budget.

SUGGESTED ACTION

Approve recommendation.

HD-A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF HARBOR COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH REQUESTING AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF LONG BEACH CONFERRING UPON AND DELEGATING THE ΤO BOARD OF HARBOR COMMISSIONERS THE AUTHORITY TO ENFORCE STATUTES AND ORDINANCES, TO ARREST AND TO PREPARE, ISSUE, AND DELIVER WRITTEN NOTICES TO APPEAR INSIDE THE HARBOR DISTRICT AND AT SPECIFIC PREMISES OUTSIDE THE HARBOR DISTRICT

14 WHEREAS, Section 1203(b) of the Long Beach City Charter provides the 15 Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners the power and duty for and on behalf of the 16 City to operate publicly owned facilities incident to the operation of the Harbor District, both inside and outside of the Harbor District; and

18 WHEREAS, the Harbor Department is headquartered at 415 W. Ocean 19 Boulevard in Long Beach ("Port Administration Building"), which is part of the Civic Center 20 Plaza, and it has an associated underground parking structure ("parking structure"); and 21 WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1203(d) of the Long Beach City Charter, the 22 Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners has the power and duty on behalf of the City 23 to control and have jurisdiction of the Harbor District and "to make and enforce in the Harbor 24 District general rules and regulations, to the extent that may be necessary or reguisite for 25 port purposes and harbor development, and in carrying out the powers elsewhere vested 26 in the Commission"; and

27 WHEREAS, Section 1203(t) of the Long Beach City Charter provides that the 28 Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners has the power and duty "to adopt and enforce

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such ordinances, orders, regulations, and practices as are necessary for the proper
 administration and discharge of its duties and powers, or for the management and
 government of the Harbor District and its facilities"; and

WHEREAS, Section 1204 of the Charter of the City of Long Beach empowers
the City Council, by ordinance, to confer upon and delegate to the Board of Harbor
Commissioners such additional powers and duties which the City Council deems
necessary or convenient to carry out the general purposes of the Board of Harbor
Commissioners; and

9 WHEREAS, the Board of Harbor Commissioners has adopted Ordinance No. 10 HD-1903 amending and restating the authority of the Harbor Department Director of 11 Security, the Chief Port Security Officer, and Harbor Patrol Officers to enforce statutes and 12 ordinances, to arrest and to prepare, issue and deliver written Notices to Appear within the 13 Harbor District of the City of Long Beach and Ordinance No. HD-2305 which conveys these 14 same authorities outside of the Harbor District at the Port Administration Building and 15 parking structure, in addition to several other locations at the Civic Center Plaza; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Harbor Commissioners desires the assistance of the Harbor Department Security Division to enforce statutes and ordinances, to arrest and to prepare, issue and deliver written notices to appear within the Harbor District and at the underground parking structure; and

20 WHEREAS, Ordinance No. HD-2378 passed by the Board of Harbor 21 Commissioners on February 28, 2022, is null and void and is hereby repealed because the 22 conditions precedent needed for its existence did not exist at the time; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. HD-3069 passed by the Board of Harbor Commissioners on February 28, 2022, is null and void and is hereby repealed because it did not specify all jurisdictions where the Harbor Department Security Division shall have additional authority to enforce statutes and ordinances, to arrest, and to prepare, issue, and deliver written notices to appear.

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NOW, THEREFORE, the Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners requests as follows:

Sec. 1. That the City Council pursuant to Section 1204 of the Long Beach City Charter confer upon and delegate to the Board of Harbor Commissioners, the ability to amend Ordinance No. HD-1903, as it may be amended or replaced from time to time, to allow the Director of Security, the Chief Port Security Officer, and Harbor Patrol Officers to 7 have additional authority to enforce statutes and ordinances, to arrest, and to prepare, 8 issue and deliver written notices to appear within the Harbor District, at the Port Administration Building, and at the parking structure. 9

Sec. 2. The delegation of such powers and duties requested herein would become operative upon adoption of: (i) a City Council ordinance conferring upon and delegating to the Harbor Department such powers and duties; (ii) a Board of Harbor Commissioners' resolution accepting such delegation; and (iii) a Board of Harbor Commissioners' ordinance amending Ordinance No. HD-1903 granting the following authorities to the Director of Security, the Chief Port Security Officer, and Harbor Patrol Officers:

Within the Harbor District, at the Port Administration Building, and at the parking structure (including the loading docks or ramps), the authority to enforce the following provisions and the authority, pursuant to California Penal Code Section 836.5, to arrest persons and to prepare, issue and deliver to any arrested person a written Notice to Appear in court and to release such person from custody upon receiving from him his written promise to appear in court for any violation of any provision enumerated herein:

California Vehicle Code Sections 21211(B) (no parking in bike lane), 21960 (restricting use of freeways by pedestrians and bicyclists), 21961 (restricting pedestrians' crossing of roadways to crosswalks), 22500(L) (parking front of curb cut out access ramp), 22502(B) (parking the wrong way), 22507.8 (improperly parking in spaces designated for persons with

California Penal Code Section 537 (defrauding an innkeeper); and

Arrests which require booking of the offender are to be handled and processed by the Long Beach Police Department.

Sec. 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the
 Board of Harbor Commissioners, and the Secretary of the Board shall certify to the vote
 adopting this resolution and shall cause a certified copy of this resolution to be filed with
 the City Clerk. The City Clerk shall post the resolution in three (3) conspicuous places in
 the City of Long Beach.

B. Arrests which require booking of the offender are to be handled and processed by the Long Beach Police Department.

Section 3. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by
City Council and cause it to be posted in three (3) conspicuous places in the City of Long
Beach, and it shall take effect on the thirty-first (31st) day after it is approved by the Mayor.
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
