I am writing to let you know that I have confirmed with the developer that the project has always been designed to use all-electric cooking appliances and heat pumps for heating and cooling, and there will be no in-unit gas fixtures. Nothing will use gas, except for the central boiler system for hot water, as there will be no in-unit hot water heaters. Use of all-electric in-unit appliances would have been required by local regulations at the time of building permit application in any case.
