

HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL City of Long Beach California

RECOMMENDATION:

Declare Ordinance amending Sections 16.16.015 and 16.16.017 of the Long Beach Municipal Code, related to allowing non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels in designated skateparks for a one-year trial period, read the first time and laid over to the next regular meeting of the City Council for final reading. (Districts 1, 2, 4, 5, 6 and 9)

DISCUSSION

In 2004, the Houghton Park skatepark was opened to the public and the City Council approved Section 16.16.017 of the Long Beach Municipal Code, which created a one-year trial period for the coexistence of skateboard riders and bicycle motocross (BMX) riders only at the Houghton Park skatepark. During the trial period, there were no incidents, injuries, or conflicts of any kind reported, and both skateboard riders and BMX riders peacefully and safely coexisted. However, when the one-year trial period expired in 2005, it was never formally extended. Therefore, for the last several years, any BMX rider in a City skatepark has technically been in violation of the law and subject to citation, although a ban on bikes and other apparatus in the skateparks has not been actively enforced.

Since 2004, five additional skateparks have been built throughout the City, at 14th Street Park, Bixby Park, Drake Park, El Dorado Park West, and Orizaba Park, with a new skatepark at Ernest S. McBride, Sr. Park under construction. In addition to skateboards and BMX bikes, the use of the skateparks by other types of non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels, such as in-line skates and scooters, has increased dramatically. All of these different types of non-motorized recreational apparatus have peacefully and safely coexisted in the City's skateparks.

At its August 18, 2011 meeting, the Parks and Recreation Commission approved a recommendation to the City Council to amend the Municipal Code to allow non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels in City skateparks, as compatible with state law, for a one-year trial period.

The Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine is requesting a revision to Sections 16.16.015 and 16.16.017 of the Municipal Code to allow the use of non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels in all City skateparks for a one-year trial period. At the end of the one-year trial period, if all riders continue to peacefully and safely coexist, all riders will then be allowed to permanently use City skateparks, which will cause Section 16.16.017 to be eliminated, and Section 16.16.015 to define the law. All riders must comply with park safety by wearing helmets and elbow and knee pads at all times. In addition, in order to comply with state law, the amended section would require that "children under the age of fourteen (14) are not permitted to use skateparks without adult supervision."

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Gary J. Anderson on October 21, 2011, and Budget Management Officer Victoria Bell on October 26, 2011.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on February 7, 2012, in order to implement the Ordinance in a timely manner.

FISCAL IMPACT

Adoption of the Ordinance will result in minimal costs associated with updating the existing signage at each location to reflect the applicable municipal code. Sufficient funding is available in the General Fund (GP) in the Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine (PR). There is no impact to jobs associated with the recommended action.

16.16.015 Designated Skatepark.

"Designated Skatepark" means an area within a park or other public Α. property which is posted as a skatepark permitting one or more skate activities, and which is reserved exclusively, either during all hours of operation, or during posted times, for one or more skate activities.

- "Director" means the director of parks, recreation and marine or his B. designee.
- C. "Skate activity" means the use of a "skateboard", as defined in section 10.54.010 of this code, or rollerskating", as defined in section 10.52.010 of this code any non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels.
 - "Skater" means any person participating in a skate activity. D.
- The director is authorized to temporarily designate an area on any public E. property as a designated skatepark.
- Skaters must wear a safety helmet, elbow pads and kneepads at all times F. while participating in a skate activity within a designated skatepark.
- No person, other than a skater or a BMX bike rider_as authorized and G. posted pursuant to section 16.16.017, is permitted within a designated skatepark, except that spectators may sit or stand in areas designated for that purpose.
- No organized activity, event or competition shall take place in any Η. designated skatepark without the written permission of the director.
- No portion of any designated skatepark may be modified, altered, or added 1. to in any manner without the written permission of the director.
- Except as authorized and posted pursuant to section 16.16.017 of this chapter, no bicycles or scooters are permitted within any designated skatepark.
- J. K. Skate activities are limited within the designated skatepark to surfaces, equipment or obstacles installed for that purpose. No skate activity is permitted on walls

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or other boundary structures or seating areas immediately surrounding or adjoining the designated skatepark.

- L. K. Children under the age of fourteen (14) are not permitted to use skateparks without adult supervision.
- All non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels shall be in good working order, properly equipped and in a condition which does not cause mud or dirt to be deposited in the skatepark.
- The director is authorized to post additional rules he determines are necessary for the safe operation of the designated skatepark.

A violation of this section shall be an infraction punishable by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for a first offense and not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for a second offense within a twelve (12) month period. Three (3) or more violations of this section within a twelve (12) month period may be charged as a misdemeanor.

- 16.16.017 BMX bicycles Non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels in designated skateparks.
- "Bike riderRider" means a person using a BMX bicycle non-motorized Α. recreational apparatus with wheels in a designated skatepark.
- "BMX bike" "Non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels" means any B. type of recreational or sports apparatus without a motor that is propelled by human force and moves on wheels, such as a bicycle, skateboard, scooter, in-lineskates, etc.a single speed bicycle with wheels between eighteen inches (18") and twenty inches (20") in diameter, a free front wheel, and a working handbrake on the rear wheel.
- "Director" means the director of parks, recreation and marine or his C. designee.
- "Properly equipped BMX bike" means a bicycle that has handlebar grips. D. Pegs, if any, shall be smooth with end caps, or must be removed before entering the

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skatepark. All non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels The bicycle shall be in good working order, properly equipped and in a condition which does not cause mud or dirt to be deposited in the skatepark.

- On a trial basis, the utilization of non-motorized recreational apparatus with E. wheels BMX bike riding is permitted in the Houghton park skateparkall City owned skateparks (except El Dorado Park West) during hours determined by the director.
- Bike riders Riders must wear a safety helmet, elbow pads and kneepads at F. all times while riding within the skatepark.
- Only properly equipped BMX bikes may be ridden in the skatepark. The final G. determination as to whether a bicycle is a properly equipped BMX bike shall be made by the director.

H.—The director is authorized to post additional rules he determines are necessary for the safe operation of the designated skatepark.

—H. The director shall have the discretion to terminate the pilot program prior to its scheduled conclusion.

-I.____This section shall cease to be of any effect on October <u>1</u> 2005, February 28, 2013 unless extended.

A violation of this section shall be an infraction punishable by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for a first offense and not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for a second offense within a twelve (12) month period. Three (3) or more violations of this section within a twelve (12) month period may be charged as a misdemeanor.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AMENDING THE LONG BEACH MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 16.16.015 AND 16.16.017, ALL RELATING TO SKATEBOARDING

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

Section 1. Section 16.16.015 of the Long Beach Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

16.16.015 - Designated Skatepark.

- A. "Designated Skatepark" means an area within a park or other public property which is posted as a skatepark permitting one or more skate activities, and which is reserved exclusively, either during all hours of operation, or during posted times, for one or more skate activities.
- B. "Director" means the director of parks, recreation and marine or his designee.
- C. "Skate activity" means the use of any non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels.
 - D. "Skater" means any person participating in a skate activity.
- E. The director is authorized to temporarily designate an area on any public property as a designated skatepark.
- F. Skaters must wear a safety helmet, elbow pads and kneepads at all times while participating in a skate activity within a designated skatepark.

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- G. No person, other than a skater as authorized and posted pursuant to section 16.16.017, is permitted within a designated skatepark, except that spectators may sit or stand in areas designated for that purpose.
- H. No organized activity, event or competition shall take place in any designated skatepark without the written permission of the director.
- I. No portion of any designated skatepark may be modified, altered, or added to in any manner without the written permission of the director.
- J. Skate activities are limited within the designated skatepark to surfaces, equipment or obstacles installed for that purpose. No skate activity is permitted on walls or other boundary structures or seating areas immediately surrounding or adjoining the designated skatepark.
- K. Children under the age of fourteen (14) are not permitted to use skateparks without adult supervision.
- L. All non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels shall be in good working order, properly equipped and in a condition which does not cause mud or dirt to be deposited in the skatepark.
- M. The director is authorized to post additional rules he determines are necessary for the safe operation of the designated skatepark.

A violation of this section shall be an infraction punishable by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for a first offense and not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for a second offense within a twelve (12) month period. Three (3) or more violations of this section within a twelve (12) month period may be charged as a misdemeanor.

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Section 2. Section 16.16.017 of the Long Beach Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

- 16.16.017 Non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels in designated skateparks.
 - A. "Bike Rider" means a person using a non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels in a designated skatepark.
 - B. "Non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels" means any type of recreational or sports apparatus without a motor that is propelled by human force and moves on wheels, such as a bicycle, skateboard, scooter, in-line skates, etc.
 - C. "Director" means the director of parks, recreation and marine or his designee.
 - D. All non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels shall be in good working order, properly equipped and in a condition which does not cause mud or dirt to be deposited in the skatepark.
 - E. On a trial basis, the utilization of non-motorized recreational apparatus with wheels is permitted in all City owned skateparks during hours determined by the director.
 - F. Bike Riders must wear a safety helmet, elbow pads and kneepads at all times while riding within the skatepark.
 - G. The director is authorized to post additional rules he determines are necessary for the safe operation of the designated skatepark.
 - H. The director shall have the discretion to terminate the pilot program prior to its scheduled conclusion.
 - This section shall cease to be of any effect on February 28,
 unless extended.

A violation of this section shall be an infraction punishable by a fine of

not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for a first offense and not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for a second offense within a twelve (12) month period. Three (3) or more violations of this section within a twelve (12) month period may be charged as a misdemeanor.

Section 3. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by the City Council and cause it to be posted in three (3) conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach, and it shall take effect on the thirty-first (31st) day after it is approved by the Mayor.
