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RESOLUTION NO. RES-12-0025

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF LONG BEACH IN OPPOSITION TO ANY CUTS,
REPEAL AND/OR REDUCTION OF SERVICES PROVIDED
BY THE HAYDEN LAW

WHEREAS, in 1998, the State of California adopted SB 1785, authored by Senator Tom Hayden, as part of a comprehensive effort to overhaul then-existing guidelines for the humane retention, treatment, and euthanization of stray animals; and

WHEREAS, the Hayden Law expanded local shelters' mandatory holding period from seventy-two (72) hours to between four (4) and six (6) days and established clear guidelines and provided State funding for local shelters to administer necessary veterinary care and humane euthanasia for unclaimed animals; and

WHEREAS, repeal of the Hayden Law could lead to the hasty euthanization of lost animals before their owners can be found and will compromise the humane and ethical treatment of animals;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. The City Council opposes any cuts, repeal and/or reduction of services provided by the Hayden Law in its present form.

Section 2. The City Clerk is directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to Governor Jerry Brown, the members of the California Legislature representing the Long Beach area, and any other officials, agencies, entities, and individuals as may be deemed appropriate.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
