I live in Pasadena and I can tell you that the 210 is a heavily congested corridor. The huge increase in traffic came when the 210/15 connection was completed. Metro projects that the proposed tunnel will bring 140,000 cars and trucks per day through the corridor. The increase in traffic and consequent pollution to all communities along the corridor will be devastating.

Metro speaks out of both sides of the mouth. They state that the tunnel will facilitate goods movement while stating that there will be few or no trucks. They state that they are evaluating the performance of the tunnel with and without truck traffic.

In order to finance this project Metro admits it will be a tolled roadway. We know that many drivers will take surface streets in order to avoid a toll. Many trucks will avoid the toll as well thus undercutting the goal of goods movement.
