### Summer Day Camps

## KNOW YOUR LONG BEACH PARK: MOSSY KENT PARK



Mossy Kent Park is a small .10-acre park located at 221 Marina Drive and Oil Dock Road in Alamitos Bay Marina Basin 2. This small waterfront lawn area was developed as part of the Alamitos Bay Marina in 1958. Visitors can enjoy breathtaking views of the marina from the small landscaped area which has a memorial bench and plaque dedicated to Maurice "Mossy" Kent, who passed

away in 1998, but who left a lifetime of contributions to the Long Beach boating community.

Mr. Kent was a long time boating enthusiast, boating safety instructor and Marine Advisory Commission member and Chairman. He was instrumental in the campaign to pass the bond issue for the development of the Long Beach Shoreline Marina.

He was the founder and a Commodore of the Long Beach

Yacht Club. He was the founder and a president of the Long Beach Marina Boat Owner's Association.

He was the Commander and Education Chairman of the U.S. Power Squadron, Long Beach Unit. He instructed more than 12,000 students in safe boating classes for more than 41 years.

The unnamed park site was named for Mr. Kent on February 13, 2001.

## Pet Adoption Events A Success

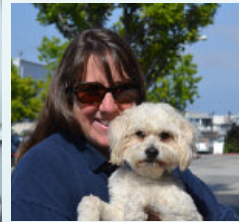
Long Beach Animal Care Services (ACS) hosted the KLOS Radio Heidi & Frank Pet Adoption event on June 7 at the spcaLA P.D. Pitchford Companion Animal Village.



More than 50 animals were adopted. Each adoption included initial vaccinations, spaying or neutering, a veterinary exam, microchip and goodie bag. Attendees enjoyed vendor booths and prize drawings, and participated in silent auctions to support animal care causes.

ACS transported three dogs to Humane Society for Southwest Washington from the Hawthorne Airport as part of an adoption program sponsored by the Wings of Rescue, a non profit animal rescue organization that transports thousands of animals each year in private airplanes to new forever homes and other rescue organizations. Shelter Me

and the Bark Avenue Foundation also supported the effort. In April, staff was able to send several dogs to new homes in Idaho through this program.

### Alamitos Bay Marina Rebuild

The next phase of the Alamitos Bay Marina Rebuild project is underway. The installation of the Southern California Edison Utility Backbone for Basins 2 and 3 is in progress and all related dredging permits have been approved. This phase will be completed in about four months.
