¹ Available Administrative Fee Fund Balance includes a July 2004 City Council approved Non-General Fund (Rental Rehabilitation Program) loan of \$2,900,000 to the Housing Authority from a HUD grant through the City's Housing Services Bureau that was forgiven at the May 2014 City Council meeting. The \$2.9 million is now included in the unrestricted admin fee operating reserve. The unrestricted within fee operating reserve at 5/31/14 is \$5,933,574. There is not income for the current year in the amount of \$1,108,635, which includes an increase in HAP funding in the amount of \$728,241. This increase in HAP funds plus prior year HAP reserves of \$2,520,648 are reserved for future HAP payments and may be subject to recapture. The not HAP restricted fund balance at 5/31/14 is \$3,248,889, of which \$2,704,923 is restricted for the HCVprogram and \$543,966 is restricted for the VASH program. It is HUD's policy that the Housing Authority may use the restricted HAP reserves to pay for any expenses over and above the amount of HAP subsidy received from HUD. The current fiscal year administrative fee not income is \$380,394, which is calculated by subtracting administrative expenses from the total administrative fees earned by HUD.
