Renovated Bixby Park Opens

Mayor Robert Garcia, Vice Mayor Suja Lowenthal, the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Marine, and the Tidelands Capital Improvement Division joined the public at the grand opening of the Bixby Park Bluff renovation on November 1.



The Bixby Park Bluff project included replacing the grass and irrigation system south of Ocean Boulevard between Junipero and Cherry avenues, and adding new staircases and an ADA-accessible path down to the beach, with lighting, emergency call boxes and drought-tolerant landscaping.

The improvements at Bixby Park Bluff are making it easier for visitors to enjoy the park and beach. The lighted staircases and path enable residents to easily and safely access overnight parking at the Beach Parking Lot through the Community Parking Program.

The staircases and path will also connect with the new Beach Pedestrian Path project which, when completed, will provide completely car-free access to the beach from the Downtown Shoreline Marina to 54th Place.

Signs are being added to two historic World War II gunpads on the bluff, informing visitors of the military history of the site.

Belmont Plaza Olympic Pool "Closing Ceremony"

Residents and many who have swam and used the Belmont Pool throughout their lives including several Olympians, gathered to say a final goodbye to the Belmont Plaza Olympic Pool on October 26. The pool was closed in January 2013 when it was determined that the Belmont Pool Natatorium was seismically and structurally unsafe.

While not able to access the pool, attendees viewed the pool from the inside of the lifeguard office located in a seismically safe portion of the building. Many guests brought trophies, medals, and other pool memorabilia to share.

The Belmont Plaza Olympic Pool opened in 1968, and hosted the U.S. Olympic Swim Trials that year and in 1976, as well as NCAA championships in 1974 and 1978 and several collegiate conference championship events. It was a training site during the 1984 Olympic Games held in Los Angeles. In addition, more than 200,000 recreational users enjoyed swimming in the pool every year.

The Belmont Plaza Temporary Pool opened in December 2013, so the community could continue to have year-round access to a versatile pool with ample opportunities for recreational and lap swimming, water exercise classes, competitive swimming and water polo programs.

The City Council approved programmatic plans for the new Belmont Beach and Aquatic Center on October 21, 2014. The Center's plans include multiple bodies of water and a separate diving well.

The design and environmental review processes continue, with hopes to begin construction in 2016.

The demolition, set to begin in late October, will take approximately six months to complete.

14th Street Park Fitness Zone Opens

Mayor Robert Garcia, Councilwoman Lena Gonzalez and the Departments of Parks, Recreation and Marine and Public Works invited the public to an opening ceremony for the new Fitness Zone at 14th Street Park, between Locust Avenue and Palmer Court, on Saturday, October 25. Fitness Zones are free, easy-to-use outdoor gyms with top-quality exercise equipment suitable for all fitness levels.

"This project is part of the transformation of 14th street and the Washington neighborhood," Mayor Robert Garcia said. "What was once blighted has become a popular park, where residents can enjoy leisure and social activities, and there

are more improvements to come."

"Fitness Zones are a great way for residents of all ages to live a healthier, more active lifestyle. The Zones are accessible to those on a tight budget. They are conveniently located in neighborhood parks and include some

The Fitness Zone incorporates:

- Leg press machine with four seats
- Lower body exercise machine
- Stand up pendulum for abdominal exercise that accommodates four people at a time
- Cross-country ski machine that accommodates two people at a time
- Vertical press for legs and arms (ADA Accessible)
- Pull down lift for lats (back muscles) (ADA Accessible)
- Chest press (ADA Accessible)
- · Press and pull for upper body exercise

The Fitness Zone has a colored paved path for circuit training. The project also included drain repair, and water-wise plant landscaping at the entry on Locust Avenue. The 14th Street Fitness Zone was funded with \$117,500 from one-time infrastructure dollars. Fitness Zones are also available at Admiral Kidd, Coolidge and Orizaba Parks.



Mayor Visits Parks, Recreation & Marine

On October 9, a standing room only group of Parks, Recreation and Marine employees and managers filled Wardlow Park's community center for a visit by newly elected Long Beach Mayor Robert Garcia. The Mayor, who has been visiting with each city department, thanked the attendees for their service to the city and made note of how well the department has performed under the current economic downturn.

"The future is good and bright," he said. Garcia continued by speaking on the importance of public service, "Our mission, and at the core of all public missions, is to serve the public good. We are working to improve the lives of people and the community," he said.

When it came to the future, Garcia said he saw both greater opportunity and a more stable economic environment as well as the need, in the near future, to approach the community for ways to increase revenue. He then spoke of his vision of the future of the city and his guiding principles, which he broke down into these four categories: creating an open

Garcia spoke of his time in the Long Beach educational system and was especially focused on the future of underserved Long Beach youth. He stressed the important role the city should have in promoting growth and training by providing internships and mentoring opportunities to the city's youth.

Know Your Long Beach Park: Long Beach Senior Center

For older adults in Long Beach, the Long Beach Senior Center at 1150 E. 4th Street is "the place where fun begins." This motto is the inspiration behind an amazing array of social, fitness and cultural programs that appeal to the interests of seniors, and that are offered six days a week. A glance at the Center's monthly events calendar shows times for billiards, table tennis, games & cards, weaving, computer classes, cooking demonstrations, round dance class, social dances, gym hours, movies and holiday celebrations.

The Center has a Gift & Thrift Shop, a library, meeting rooms, a spacious ballroom, auditorium and dining facilities for rent. The Friendly Cup Café is open for all ages Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. and serves delicious breakfasts, lunches and snacks.

Seniors have convenient access to information about social services such as social security, the Cal Fresh nutrition program, HICAP health advocates, Disabled Resource Center mobile training and Medicare benefits. Notary Public and Tax Preparation services are also offered during the year.

Seniors are able to access health services such as flu shot clinics, and memory testing. The St. Mary Medical Center operates a drop-in clinic on the fourth Friday of each month form 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. The "Heart of Ida" organization teaches weekly "stepping on" classes to help seniors manage the risk of falls and recover from falls.

The Senior Citizen Advisory Commission meets on every second Thursday at 9 a.m. at the Center to advise the Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine, and the Mayor and City Council about matters pertaining to older Americans.
