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ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH RELATING TO DOWNTOWN PARKING METER REVENUES

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

9 Section 1. The City agrees to account for parking meter revenues
10 collected within that area of downtown Long Beach shown on Exhibit "A" and described
11 on Exhibit "B" (the "Downtown Core"), incorporated herein by this reference. Such
12 revenues shall be distributed between the City and the Downtown Long Beach
13 Association ("DLBA") or such successor organization as the City Council recognizes.
14 Sec. 2. Following the recovery by City of the costs of collection and

maintenance, including the cost of meters and signage the net revenue shall bedistributed as follows:

A. FY2007 and 2008: \$140,000 to DLBA and balance to City.

B. FY 2009 and beyond: Fifty percent (50%) of the net revenues collected from the parking meters in the Downtown Core to DLBA; the remainder to the City's General Fund. The DLBA portion shall be spent as follows:

22 1. One-half shall be used for infrastructure improvements23 within the Downtown Core area of the City.

24 2. One-half shall be used for marketing efforts that promote25 Downtown Core businesses.

Sec. 3. DLBA shall account for the receipt and expenditure of Parking
 Meter Monies in its annual report to the City.

Sec. 4. DLBA may carry-over unspent Parking Meter Monies from one

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year to the next, provided funds are accurately accounted for in DLBA's annual report
 to the City.

Sec. 5. DLBA will use none of the funds it receives for any purpose not
enumerated herein, including but not limited to, any expense (including administration
and overhead) in support of Downtown Long Beach DLBA-Political Action Committee or
any other political activity.

Sec. 6. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by the
City Council and cause it to be posted in three conspicuous places in the City of Long
Beach, and it shall take effect on the thirty-first day after it is approved by the Mayor.




