#### RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt Plans and Specifications No. R-6683, and approve and authorize the Executive Director to enter into a contract with Sully-Miller Contracting Company, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$2,306,900 for the North Long Beach Street Enhancement Program Area E in the City of Long Beach, California. (North – District 9)

#### DISCUSSION

During development of the North Long Beach Strategic Guide for Redevelopment and the North Long Beach Street Enhancement Master Plan, an opportunity was identified for street improvements in Area E (Exhibit A – Site Map).

The proposed project is part of the North Long Beach Street Enhancement Master Plan adopted by the Redevelopment Agency (Agency) on August 12, 2002. The Agency and City Council made the necessary findings of benefit, as required by California Redevelopment Law, on September 12, 2005, and November 1, 2005, respectively.

The referenced Plans and Specifications (Exhibit B – Plans & Specs Extracts), reviewed and approved by Deputy City Attorney, Lori A. Conway on February 12, 2007, were advertised for bid on February 22, 2007, and bids were opened on March 28, 2007. The Design Engineer's estimate for construction costs was \$2,023,950 and the highest bid was \$2,399,478. Sully-Miller Contracting Company, Inc., a Delaware Corporation, was the lowest responsible bidder with a bid of \$2,006,000.

The work to be done under contract will include constructing concrete curbs, gutters, and sidewalks; constructing asphalt concrete pavement and resurfacing with asphalt rubber pavement; removing concrete surfaces; doing all necessary excavation and grading; and installing pavement markers, markings and traffic striping.

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The proposed contract amount of \$2,306,900 includes a 15 percent contingency clause to cover any additional work that may become necessary during the course of construction. In the event that additional work is necessary, the contract will provide that the Executive Director may authorize contract change orders for additional work not to exceed the 15 percent contingency. Although not anticipated, any contract change orders that would exceed the 15 percent contingency will be brought before the Agency for further consideration.

#### SUGGESTED ACTION:

Adopt recommendation.


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


