## CITY COUNCIL HEARING AGENDA ITEM 1:

The Gaslamp, LLC, dba Gaslamp Restaurant and Bar, 6251 E. Pacific Coast Highway, met with City representatives, and agreed to present the Long Beach City Council with amended versions of two conditions previously recommended by the Chief of Police, as well as one additional condition regarding its application for an entertainment permit with dancing by patrons at an existing restaurant.

## SUPPLEMENTAL CONDITIONS

The first supplemental condition amends the April 24, 2007, Long Beach Police Department recommended condition number "9" to read:

In addition to the above security requirements, the permittee shall staff three (3) additional uniformed security guards during hours of when entertainment is provided, and 1/2 hour after closing. Parking lot security guards shall ensure that patrons do not loiter in the parking lot or the immediate area. They shall also ensure the patrons enter and leave the parking lot in a peaceful manner as not to disturb any nearby residents. The Chief of Police may increase or relax this condition, based on calls for service related to problems in the parking lot.

The second supplemental condition amends the April 24, 2007, Long Beach Police Department recommended condition number "13" to read:

The quarterly gross sales of food shall not be less than fifty-five (55%) percent of total gross food and alcohol sales for this same period. The permittee shall keep separate records that reflect the gross sales of food and alcohol. Gross food sales for the initial quarter, which shall end on December 31, 2007, will be utilized by the City solely for review without penalty to entertainment permit number BU20708280. Quarterly gross food and alcohol sales records, along with quarterly State Board of Equalization Sales and Use Permit records shall be provided to the City of Long Beach Business Services Officer within fourteen days following quarter end. Gross food and alcohol sales records shall be signed by Alicia Shelton and

Jennifer McDonald under penalty of perjury using the format "I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the foregoing is true and correct and that this Declaration was executed on [insert date] at Long Beach, California. Use of this information shall be limited to generation of gross sales receipt ratios, and entertainment permit compliance.

The added third recommended condition addresses underage patrons. It reads:

Persons under eighteen (18) years of age shall not be permitted to enter nor to remain on the premises after 10 p.m., unless accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.
