# **Promenade Square Tot Lot Opens**



An Opening Ceremony for the Promenade Square Park Tot Lot at The Promenade North and East First Street, was held on Saturday, December 17.

"Access to safe, fun places to recreate is a need in every neighborhood and this new tot lot will serve the many families living in Downtown that previously had to travel a half-mile away to play," said Mayor Robert Garcia. The Tot Lot includes a slide, several climbing structures and climbing rocks, a park bench, and playground safety surfacing. The design compliments the design elements of Promenade Square Park and The Promenade.

"The total project cost was \$192,000, and was supported with \$75,000 in one-time infrastructure funds from the Office of former Vice Mayor Suja Lowenthal; \$20,000 from Los Angeles County Supervisor Don Knabe; \$10,000 from the Downtown Long Beach Associates; \$7,300 raised by the Promenade Area Residents Association; and \$5,000 from the Molina Family Trust.




#### El Dorado Nature Center Named a Top Place to Visit in Southern California

#### Animal Care Services "Feels the Love" From Timmons Subaru



Long Beach Animal Care Services (LBACS) was chosen by Timmons Subaru as their local charity for their Share the Love event on December 10. Timmons Subaru will donate \$250 from the sale of each purchased or leased new vehicle sold between November 17, 2016 and January 3, 2017.

# Drake Chavez Greenbelt Artificial Turf Sports Field Project



In December, work began on the 8.75-acre Drake Chavez Greenbelt Project, which includes a striped artificial turf sport field with organic infill, a grass play area, a landscaped open space area, a pedestrian trail, benches and on-site parking. Construction is scheduled to be complete and the Greenbelt is anticipated to be open in Summer 2017.

The total cost of the Drake Chavez Project is estimated at \$3,813,000, including \$2.865 million for construction and costs for design, construction management, labor compliance and project oversight. The project is supported by \$2,513,000 from Proposition 84 grant funding for

statewide park development, \$300,000 from Los Angeles County Regional Parks and Open Space District "Per Parcel Discretionary" funding, and \$1,000,000 of FY14 one-time funding that was designated for this project.

The annual maintenance cost of the Greenbelt is about \$40,000 per year, that includes daily trash removal, irrigation repair, and plant trimming. Weed abatement and artificial turf maintenance includes brushing to rejuvenate matted fibers, aeration to avoid infill compaction, and sweeping to remove litter.

The project is the first in the City to feature an artificial turf field with organic infill. The use of artificial turf on sports fields provides a safe surface not impeded by gopher holes, ruts or

other elements that cause uneven playing areas. An artificial turf field can provide more playable hours per field, and does not need to be closed as often for re-sodding or rehabilitation as grass fields with the same amount of heavy play. The use of artificial fields can reduce maintenance costs because there is no need to reseed, re-sod or aerate.

Future Long Beach parks that are planned to have artificial turf sports fields include Seaside Park and Admiral Kidd Park.

#### **Know Your Long Beach Parks: Alamitos Heights Park**



The land for Alamitos Heights Park at E. Colorado Street and Orlena Avenue was acquired by the City of Long Beach from oil producing companies in 1923. The 1.31-acre park is a landscaped open space area between

Colorado Lagoon to the west and Marina Vista Park to the south. The site was developed as a park along with homes in the area beginning in the early 1960s.

Members of the Alamitos Heights Improvement Association (AHIA) hold events at the park including their annual 5k Fun Run and Picnic, and holiday toy drives and snow days events.

#### Marketing Campaign Building Awareness of Local Boat Slip Availability

In recent months the Long Beach Marine Bureau team has been working on a marketing campaign to help achieve 100% slip occupancy in the City's three marinas. The campaign has included traditional marketing such as advertising in trade magazines, website listings and Facebook postings. The campaign is also featured in rotation on the Long Beach Worthington Ford digital sign at the 405 freeway at Bellflower. Approximately 400,000 vehicles drive past that sign on a daily basis. As a result, we welcomed new boat owners into both Shoreline and Alamitos Bay Marinas.

Another first is the recently launched Long Beach Boat Slip Mooring public service announcement. Our marinas have never looked more beautiful. Marine Advisory Commissioner Jerry Avila graciously agreed to participate in the filming of the video with his family. Looks like they had a fun afternoon.
