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### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Recommendation to receive supporting documentation into the record, conclude the hearing, and declare ordinance relating to the temporary limitation (moratorium) on the establishment, installation, placement, construction, expansion, or issuance of permits for the use of unattended donation/recycling collection boxes or bins read, adopted as read, and laid over to the next regular meeting of the City Council for final reading; declaring the urgency thereof; and declaring this ordinance shall take effect immediately. (Citywide)

# DISCUSSION

On March 7, 2017, the City Council adopted a minute order pursuant to an agenda request which initiated a moratorium relating to the establishment, installation, placement, construction, expansion, or issuance of permits for the use of unattended donation/recycling collection boxes or bins in or on any private or public lot in the City. The moratorium was initiated pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 21.50 of the Municipal Code, "Interim Prohibition of Uses."

The attached ordinance, which has been prepared for Council's consideration, establishes a one (1) year moratorium period. During this time, the Development Services Department and the Planning Commission will undertake a study of potential amendments to the Zoning or Building regulations relating to portable unattended donation and/or recycling boxes or bins in the City of Long Beach. The one year moratorium will apply to any application for permits received after March 7, 2017, for the establishment, installation, placement, construction, expansion of unattended donation/recycling collection boxes or bins in the City of Long Beach. As of March 7, 2017, there were no new applications on

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file related to the above described uses. Therefore, for the purpose of this moratorium, there are no unattended donation and/or recycling boxes or bin applications that would be exempt from the provisions of the proposed moratorium.

## ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH RELATING TO A TEMPORARY LIMITATION ON THE ESTABLISHMENT, INSTALLATION, PLACEMENT, CONSTRUCTION, EXPANSION, OR ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR THE USE OF UNATTENDED DONATION/RECYCLING COLLECTION BOXES OR BINS IN OR ON ANY PRIVATE OR PUBLIC LOT IN THE CITY; DECLARING THE URGENCY THEREOF; AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

Section 1. Purpose and Findings. At the direction of the City Council, by Minute Order on March 7, 2017, the Department of Development Services and the Planning Commission will undertake or currently are undertaking studies of potential amendments to the Zoning or Building regulations of the City of Long Beach relating to portable unattended donation and/or recycling boxes or bins in the City of Long Beach. The City Council, concerned citizens, and other interested individuals, have expressed that changes to the existing zoning or building regulations are desired in order to prevent the unregulated proliferation of unattended donation and/or recycling boxes or bins which can, if not properly or consistently maintained, become a public nuisance as they attract graffiti, scavenging and illegal dumping near and around said uses, all of which activity leads to visual blight and a diminution in the quality of life of the City's residents and visitors. If said uses are permitted to be installed, established, constructed, expanded or operated during the pendency of said studies, such activity may defeat the effectiveness

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of zoning or building regulations ultimately adopted as a result of the current study and review to be undertaken by the Department of Development Services and the Planning Commission.

The City Council specifically finds that until such time that the Section 2. City concludes its review and study and adopts appropriate controls to regulate unattended donation and/or recycling boxes or bins in the City of Long Beach the resulting potentially negative effects of said uses will pose a current and immediate threat to the public safety, health and or welfare of the citizens, residents and visitors of the City of Long Beach.

Estimated Time for Completion of Study. It is estimated that Section 3. the study or studies undertaken in connection with the adoption of this interim ordinance shall take the Department of Development Services and the Planning Commission approximately one (1) year to complete. For the purposes of this ordinance, this interim moratorium study period shall expire no later than March 8, 2018, or at such time as the City Council does adopt appropriate zoning regulations or development standards related to all or some of the below mentioned activities, whichever is sooner.

Section 4. Prohibition on placement, construction or use of unattended donation and/or recycling boxes or bins throughout the City. During the term of the one (1) year interim (moratorium) period, no application for a use permit, building permit, construction permit, encroachment permit, variance or business license, of any kind, shall be approved, nor shall any such permit be issued, for any activity that would result in the placement of unattended donation and/or recycling boxes or bins throughout the City.

Section 5. Declaration of Urgency. This ordinance is an urgency measure, and it is urgently required for the reason that, pending completion of the necessary planning study, and a determination relative to the potential need to amend the City's Zoning Code or building regulations, it is necessary to limit construction, development or placement of unattended donation and/or recycling boxes or bins throughout the City in order to avoid the adverse impacts associated with said use that might be inconsistent with the pending revisions to the zoning or building regulations of the City being considered during the interim moratorium period.

Section 6. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance duly adopted by the City Council by a vote of five of its members and shall take effect immediately. The City Clerk shall certify to a separate roll call and vote on the question of the emergency of this ordinance and to its passage by the vote of five members of the City Council of the City of Long Beach, and cause the same to be posted in three conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach.

Section 7. This ordinance shall also be adopted by the City Council as a regular ordinance, to the end that in the event of any defect or invalidity in connection with the adoption of this ordinance as an urgency ordinance, the same shall, nevertheless, be and become effective on the thirty-first (31st) day after it is approved by the Mayor. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by the City Council of the City of Long Beach and shall cause the same to be posted in three (3) conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach.
