2.01.380 Contributions for officeholder expense fund.

4 Α. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Chapter, upon taking 5 office each elected City officeholder may establish an officeholder expense fund and may 6 solicit and accept contributions for said officeholder expense fund not to exceed a total 7 amount of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) per calendar year for City Councilmembers 8 and seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00) per calendar year for the City Attorney, City 9 Auditor, City Prosecutor and Mayor. No person shall make and no elected City officeholder 10 or officeholder expense fund shall solicit or accept from any person, a contribution or 11 contributions to the officeholder expense fund totaling more than seven hundred fifty dollars 12 (\$750.00) per calendar year for City Councilmembers and one thousand dollars 13 (\$1,000.00) per calendar year for City Attorney, City Auditor, City Prosecutor and Mayor. 14 The money in such fund shall be expended and used only for the purpose of officeholder 15 expenses associated with holding office, in accordance with and authorized by the 16 applicable provisions of Sections 8951089512 through 8952289519 of the California 17 Government Code, as amended.except for Subsection 89513(e) and that part of 18 Subsection 89513(g) relating to loans to candidates, political parties or committees. None 19 of such officeholder expense funds may be used or expended in connection with a future 20 election for an elective City office or for any expenditures that would violate the provisions of Government Code Sections 89506 or 89512 through 89519. 21

B. Each such officeholder expense fund shall be considered a
subaccount of the officeholder's controlled committee. All solicitations made and
contributions received for an officeholder expense fund shall be clearly designated as being
made or received for such uses and purposes.

C. The officeholder or his or her treasurer shall retain all receipts,
invoices, written agreements and other documents relating to expenditures from such
officeholder expense fund.

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ORDINANCE NO. 1 2 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE 3 CITY OF LONG BEACH AMENDING THE LONG BEACH 4 5 MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 2.01.380; 6 AND BY REPEALING SECTION 2.01.390, ALL RELATING TO OFFICEHOLDER ACCOUNTS 7 8 9 The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows: 10 11 Section 1. Section 2.01.380 of the Long Beach Municipal Code is 12 amended to read as follows: Contributions for officeholder expense fund. 13 2.01.380 14 Α. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Chapter, upon taking office each elected City officeholder may establish an officeholder 15 16 expense fund and may solicit and accept contributions for said officeholder 17 expense fund not to exceed a total amount of thirty thousand dollars 18 (\$30,000.00) per calendar year for City Councilmembers and seventy-five 19 thousand dollars (\$75,000.00) per calendar year for the City Attorney, City 20 Auditor, City Prosecutor and Mayor. No person shall make and no elected 21 City officeholder or officeholder expense fund shall solicit or accept from 22 any person, a contribution or contributions to the officeholder expense fund 23 totaling more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) per calendar year 24 for City Councilmembers and one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per 25 calendar year for City Attorney, City Auditor, City Prosecutor and Mayor. 26 The money in such fund shall be expended and used only for the purpose 27 of officeholder expenses associated with holding office, in accordance with 28 and authorized by the applicable provisions of Sections 89510 through

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89522 of the California Government Code, as amended. None of such officeholder expense funds may be used or expended for any expenditures that would violate the provisions of Government Code Sections 89506 or 89512 through 89519.

B. Each such officeholder expense fund shall be considered a subaccount of the officeholder's controlled committee. All solicitations made and contributions received for an officeholder expense fund shall be clearly designated as being made or received for such uses and purposes.

C. The officeholder or his or her treasurer shall retain all receipts, invoices, written agreements and other documents relating to expenditures from such officeholder expense fund.

Section 2. Section 2.01.390 of the Long Beach Municipal Code is hereby repealed.

Section 3. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by the City Council and cause it to be posted in three (3) conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach, and it shall take effect on the thirty-first (31st) day after it is approved by the Mayor.

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
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
