### Proposed Capital Improvement Program – FY 18

#### **New Revenue for CIP**

- SB-1: Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Act
  - \$ 2.5 M in 2018, \$8 M in 2019, \$8 M in 2020, could grow up to \$11 M in future years.

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- \$6.7 M in new Measure M LA County
- 0.5% increase sales tax in LA County for transportation and an indefinite extension of Measure R set to sunset in 2039
- Measure A City of Long Beach
  - \$48 M/year for Public Safety and Infrastructure
- County Prop A for Parks
- Local SB-1 State Project (PCH)

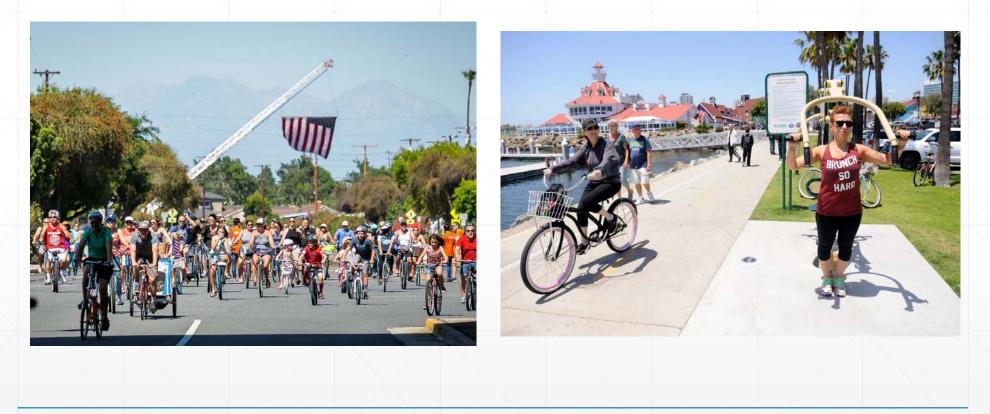

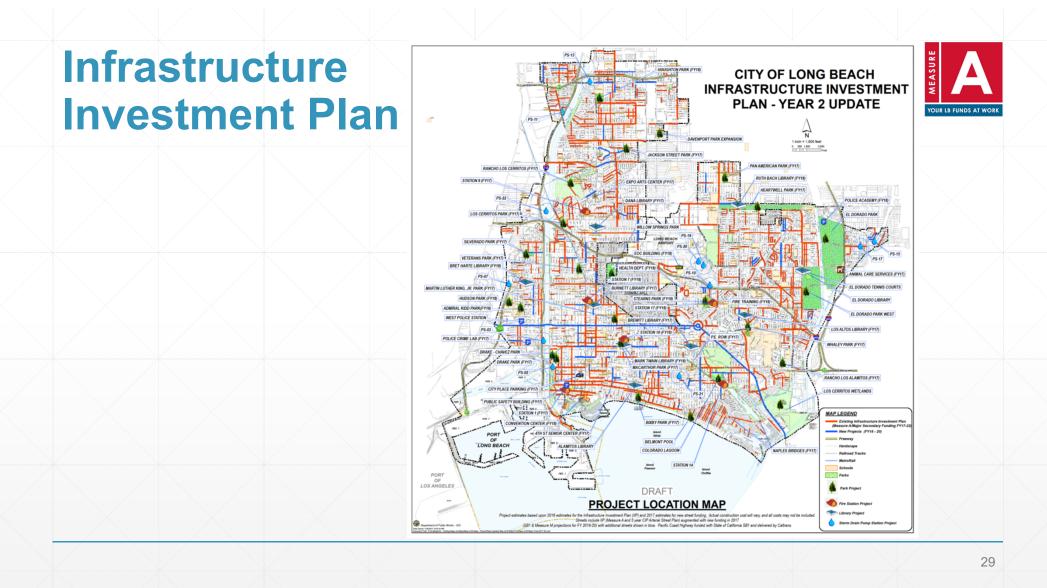

#### **Critical Infrastructure Needs**

- Technology: Required for efficiency, transparency, ability to communicate, and maintain operations for all City departments.
- Additional Parking: To support public parking, economic development, public safety departments, and access to public buildings.
- Storm Water Protection: Deficient and aged storm water facilities pose a threat to flooding.
- Staff will review and discuss options with City Council during the budget adoption process.

#### **Other Funding Opportunities**

- SB-1 State Competitive Funds
- Miscellaneous Grants (Metro, State, Federal, etc.)
- LA County Park Grant (Prop A)
- Technology Bonds
