<u>Airport Advisory Commission</u> Appointment

Rita Nayak (CD 8) – Interim Term through June 2018

Rita Nayak grew up in Long Beach, graduated from Poly High School, and is now a homeowner in the 8th District, where she has been involved in community outreach regarding the Long Beach airport. She hopes to promote a better quality of life for Long Beach residents through her work as a commissioner. By trade, Rita studied architecture and landscape design and works as a freelance designer on residential projects.

<u>Cultural Heritage Commission</u> Appointment

• Tasha Hunter (CD 8) – Interim Term through June 2018 (to fill Shannon Carmack's expired term)

Tasha Hunter lives in CD 8 and has long been active in the community, as an educator, filmmaker, event planner and youth advocate.
