


CAAP stands for Climate Action and Adaptation Plan

- Climate action is about reducing the impact we (people) have on the climate system by reducing future carbon emissions. (for example, driving less)
- Climate adaptation is about adjusting our behaviors, systems, infrastructure, to reduce the impact climate change has on us. (for example, flood proof a house)



- Actionable plan (right balance of innovation and practicality)






Process for Developing a Climate Change Mitigation Plan




Emissions Generating Sectors
