RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend to the City Manager the approval of installation of fitness equipment as an improvement for public recreation at DeForest Park and Ramona Park, which meets a recreational need within the City. (District 9)

DISCUSSION

A Fitness Station is a series of self-use pieces of fitness or activity equipment designed to allow users the opportunity to engage in healthy physical activity free of charge. The City of Long Beach, through its Department of Health and Human Services and Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine (Department) has encouraged the installation of Fitness Stations in parks throughout the City. DeForest Park, located at 6225 DeForest Avenue, and Ramona Park, located at 3301 E. 65th Street, have been identified as locations where Fitness Stations would benefit the surrounding community and these locations are consistent with the City's pedestrian and community health plans and policies.

The DeForest Park and Ramona Park Fitness Station projects are the result of 9th District infrastructure funding of \$180,000. The DeForest Park project proposes one (1) large Fitness Station with multiple pieces of fitness equipment adjacent to the playground. The Ramona Park project proposes up to four (4) Fitness Stations throughout the park with stretching signage placed on existing light poles to create a fitness loop around the park. The proposed Fitness Station project locations are included as Attachment 1.

The final designs will specify the exact locations of the Fitness Stations as well as the number and pieces of equipment and their configurations. In each project, fitness equipment accessible to users in wheelchairs will be selected and incorporated into the eventual stations.

The Parks and Recreation Commission (Commission) recommends to the City Manager plans for the development, beautification and maintenance of public-park and recreational areas, so Commission support of the proposed improvements is requested.

FISCAL IMPACT

The construction budget for the Ramona Fitness Loop is \$100,000 while the DeForest Fitness equipment is \$80,000; both are from infrastructure "Divide-by-Nine" funds from District 9. Funds are budgeted in the Capital Projects Fund (CP) in the Public Works Department (PW). There will be ongoing costs related to maintenance, which will be requested by the Department during the FY19 budget process.


RAMONA PARK PROPOSED FITNESS LOOP
