Recent History of Cannabis in California

- > (2015) Commercial Medical Cannabis
 - > AB 266, AB 243, SB 643
- > (2016) Commercial Adult-Use Cannabis
 - Proposition 64
- (2017) Medicinal and Adult-Use Regulation and Safety Act (MAUCRSA)
 - > SB 94
 - Cities retain local control

Recent History of Cannabis in Long Beach

- > (2016) Medical Cannabis Initiative
 - ➤ Measure MM/LBMC Chapter 5.90
- ➤ (2017) —Request for Adult-Use Ordinance, Social Equity Policy & Temporary 180-Day Ban
- (2018) Draft Commercial Adult-Use Cannabis Ordinance for City Council Consideration
 - ➤ LBMC Chapter 5.92

Process for Drafting Ordinance

- Prior experience with medical cannabis businesses
- > Ordinances approved by other cities
 - California (Los Angeles, San Jose, San Francisco, etc.)
 - > Other states (Oregon, Colorado, Washington, etc.)
- Neighborhood and industry group meetings
- ➤ Long Beach Cannabis Hotline/Email

Co-Location

- > Required for dispensaries
- Optional for non-dispensaries
 - Cultivators, Manufacturers, Testing Laboratories, Distributors
 - May apply as medical only, adult-use only, or co-located business
- ➤ Subject to requirements of adult-use ordinance (LBMC 5.92)

Location Requirements

- > Same buffers as medical businesses
 - > Schools, beaches, parks, libraries, daycare centers
- ➤ Title 21 of the LBMC
 - Industrial Zones Dispensaries, Testing Laboratories, Cultivators, Manufacturers, Distributors
 - Commercial Zones Dispensaries & Testing Laboratories only
 - Same zoning requirements as other similar use types
- ➤ 180-day exemption for existing medical applicants

Public Health

- > Health permits
 - Quality assurance testing
 - Packaging/labeling
 - Product storage
 - > Employee health
 - Basic sanitation standards & facilities
- > Responsible Cannabis Vendor Program

Security

- Digital surveillance systems
- > Security alarms
- Security personnel
- > Electronic age verification devices
- > Identification Badges

Enforcement

- ➤ Administrative Citations
- > Civil Penalties
- Criminal Violations
- Access to Video Camera Recordings
- > Appeals referred to Hearing Officer

Proposed Fees

> Annual Fees

- Regulatory Fee
- Fire Permit Fees
- Health Permit Fees
- > Tax Audit Fee

➤ One-Time Fees

- Application Fee
- Criminal Background Investigation Fee

Social Equity

- City Council request to include social equity in the adult-use ordinance
- Cannabis Equity Team
 - Office of Cannabis Oversight
 - Office of Equity
 - Pacific Gateway Workforce Innovation Network

Equity Programs in Other Cities

- Los Angeles, San Francisco, Sacramento, Oakland
- Florida, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts
- California Senate
 - > SB 1294
- > Equity Framework
 - > Eligibility criteria, program benefits, equity incubators

What is Cannabis Social Equity?

- Impact of Federal and State cannabis policies on low-income communities
 - Loss of property, disqualification from employment opportunities, reduced earnings potential, exclusion from public benefits, and other negative impacts
- > Cannabis decriminalization
- Cannabis social equity

Long Beach – Eligibility Criteria

- ➤ Annual family income below 80% AMI
- > At least one of the following:
 - Arrested or convicted for a cannabis related crime in Long Beach that could have been prosecuted as a misdemeanor or citation under current California law; or
 - Lived in a low to moderate-income census tract in Long Beach for a minimum of 3 years
- Applicants with serious convictions will not be eligible

Business Assistance

- > Fee waivers
- > Expedited application review
- > Expedited plan checks
- > Business License tax deferrals
- > Application workshops
- > Fresh Start clinics
- > Incubator support

Employment Opportunities

- > 25% equity hire requirement
 - Good faith effort to hire equity employees
- Pacific Gateway Workforce Innovation Network
 - > Public outreach, employee registry and eligibility verification
 - Connecting employees with businesses
 - Monitoring and compliance
- > Labor peace agreement

Cannabis Equity Program Costs

➤ One-time General Fund costs

- > \$200,000 Pacific Gateway 25% hire program
- > \$50,000 Expedited plan-check review
- > \$16,000 Expungement clinics
- Offset by current year savings in excess of FY 18 Department General Fund savings targets.

Ongoing costs

- Offset through Equity Hire fee charged to cannabis businesses
- > Estimated at \$2,000 per business annually

Next Steps

- > Temporary moratorium has expired
- Long Beach will maintain an <u>implicit</u> ban on commercial adult-use cannabis activities
 - Ban may only be lifted with approval from the City Council
- >August 2018
 - Earliest that adult-use cannabis sales could begin
