SERRF STATUS REPORT December 4, 2018

SERRF OPERATION

During the period October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018, SERRF accomplished the following:

- SERRF received 360,000 tons of refuse.
- SERRF ended the year with 166,000 megawatts of energy sold to SCE.
- SERRF destroyed a total of 573,000 pounds of narcotics and drug-related paraphernalia. This is a 40,000-pound increase over the previous year.
- SERRF completed all the scheduled major maintenance and capital replacement work for the period. The cumulative cost of this work performed during fiscal year 2017-2018 was approximately \$6 million dollars.
- SERRF is transitioning into new power purchase agreements with SCE and CAL-ISO to sell SERRF electricity after the current 30-year power purchase agreement between Long Beach and SCE expires on December 7, 2018.
- SERRF amended the Operations and Maintenance agreement between Long Beach and Covanta to begin a 4-year process of equipment replacement and refurbishment. In the amendment, Long Beach agreed to commit \$8.7 million into SERRF and Covanta agreed to commit \$5 million into SERRF.
