
#### **Governance Structure**

- The City of Long Beach is governed by the Mayor and City Council.
- There are several Departments that report to the City Manager.
- The Airport is one of those
   Departments that report to the
   City Manager.




#### **Budget Process Overview**

- The Airport follows a budget process under the guidelines set by the Budget Office (a bureau of the Department of Financial Management under the City Manager)
- The Airport's budget is a part of the City's Proposed Budget that is presented to the Mayor and City Council for adoption.

#### Airport's Internal Process

The City uses a "Base Budget" approach to budgeting. This process involves using the previous year's adopted budget as a baseline and then makes enhancements or reductions to that budget. The process typically follows these steps:

- 1. <u>Division Requests</u>
- 2. Admin/Finance Review
- 3. <u>Director's Decision</u>
- 4. Submittal of Airport's Budget

### City's Adopted Budget Book

- Once the budget is adopted, the City will prepare the Adopted Budget Book.




#### Reporting of Budget Numbers

The Airport has a budget chapter in the City's Adopted Budget Book. The Airport's adopted budget numbers are reported in that chapter.

- Revenues \$55.6 million
- Expenditures \$49.0 million
- The Funds are 100% Airport




#### Details of Adopted Budget
