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Table 3. Focus Areas

Goal: Decrease the number of STDs and HIV in Long Beach.

Focus Area: Youth

Objectives:

- 1. To increase STD/HIV awareness among youth, especially youth of color
- 2. To provide resources to facilitate STD/HIV prevention
- Poly High School Health Fair—distributed educational brochures
- Working with CSULB Health Science Department—making students aware of the STD rates and have them develop a program to reduce STD rates
- Jordan High School STD/HIV 101 Education Series (About 400 students) for school years 17/18 and 18/19
- Trained CSULB Nursing Students to present STD/HIV material to high school students
- · Coordinated with The Center to have them present about gender identity to Jordan High School students and faculty
- Educated approximately 40 students from Beach High School

Focus Area: Providers

Objectives:

- 1. To ensure healthcare clinicians adequately diagnose, treat, and report STDs
- 2. To increase healthcare clinician situational awareness regarding STDs/HIV in Long Beach
- 3. To increase awareness and prescribing or referral for PrEP
- Presented at Long Beach Memorial Medical Center Family Residency Program about syphilis diagnosis and treatment
- Coordinated and presented Epidemiology of STDs in Long Beach at the Long Beach STD/HIV Clinical Update (Provided in collaboration with CDPH)
- Presented at the Infection Control Meeting at Miller Children's Hospital about STD testing protocol for pregnant females.
- Published Annual STD/HIV Surveillance Report, September 2018
- Belinda and Dr. Davis attended Congenital Syphilis Summit (Oakland, CA), hosted by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH)
- Presented to the Infection Control Specialist at College Medical Center about syphilis diagnosis, treatment and follow-up.
- Sent out a Health Alerts covering: Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) and Post-Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP)
 recommendations for patients who test HIV negative, Congenital syphilis increase in Long Beach, and Identify and
 prevent Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) by testing and referring patients either to medical care or Pre-Exposure
 Prophylaxis (PrEP)
- Educated Long Beach Memorial Medical Center residents on the testing and treatment guidelines for STDs and HIV

Focus Area: At Risk Populations (MSM, youth, pregnant women and people of color)

Objectives:

- 1. To increase STD/HIV awareness among high risk populations
- 2. To provide resources and decrease barriers to facilitate STD/HIV prevention
- 3. To increase awareness and use of PrEP
- Pride Parade (May 19, 2018)- handed out brochures and condoms
- Pop Up Town (North Long Beach)- handed out brochures and condoms
- Khmer Health Fair (June 16, 2018)- handed out brochures and condoms
- Health Fair (August)- handed out brochures

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- Long Beach Press Telegram published an article surround the rising number of STD/HIV, titled "Long Beach releases 2017
 STD report, and health officials are concerned"
- Hired 1 new Disease Intervention Specialist, who will interview clients and ensure proper treatment, notification of partners, and partner testing and treatment (September 2018)
- Displayed the KNOWMORE campaign at the LGBTQ+ The Center (May 2018)
- Presented the KnowMore Campaign at the Long Beach Public Health Conference (April 2018)
- Launched the KnowMore Campaign (June 20018)
- Presented at APHA- Missed Opportunities of CT and GC Detection when not using Extra Genital Testing (November 2018).
- Distributed over 20,000 condoms to areas where disease burden is high

Focus Area: Our Partners

Objectives:

- 1. To collaborate with our partners to develop and implement a Long Beach STD/HIV Prevention and Control Plan
- 2. To collaborate with our partners to meet the above objectives
- Long Beach HIV Planning Group—co chair; developing HIV/STD Action Plan
- PrEP sub committee—various stakeholders; focused on provider and community outreach
- Partner Services sub committee
- Collaborated with Walgreens to ensure providers have access to syphilis treatment
- Career Fair at CSULB- introduced students to public health careers
- Applying with The Center for a Public Health Associate through a program with the CDC, where the CDC funds an employee to provide public health core services locally for 2 years
- Training future Pubic Health Interns from CSULB
- Met with LBUSD staff to discussion collaboration with the department
- LBDHHS Sexual clinic sees individuals who are referred to us at the end of year due to the depletion of funds or when their provider is on vacation

Focus Area: Funding

Objectives:

1. Increase funding for STDs

- Meet with LA County to increase STD funds that are allocated for the LBDHHS
- Participate in Public Health Alliance's Southern California STI Workgroup advocating for funding
- As a member of the Health Officers Association of California, developing a \$50m budget request for CD Control, including STDs
