

## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration/Environmental Assessment (IS/MND/EA) has been prepared pursuant to the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (see Public Resources Code Sections 21000-21177), as well as the State CEQA Guidelines (see Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, Sections 15063); enclosed as <a href="Part 1">Part 1</a> of this document. Also, as the City is seeking funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), the IS/MND/EA has been prepared pursuant to the guidelines and regulations of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), enclosed as <a href="Part 2">Part 2</a> of this document.

The IS/MND/EA was made available for public review and comment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15070. The public review period commenced on August 3, 2009, and expired on September 1, 2009. Description

The inadequate River Avenue drainage system has resulted in flooding to adjacent residents. The project proposed to bring the system flood protection in this area to a full 10 yr protection level. The proposal involves construction of a parallel storm drain system along River Avenue (which is located Wardlow Road/23rd Street to the north to an underground storage (detention) basin proposed on the SCE property). The detention basin would temporarily hold 2 acre ft of storm water during heavy flows and then release the flows as the storm abates. The proposed detention basin would allow the downstream pipe to no longer flow full. The City has elected to proceed with the 10 yr frequency flood level protection improvement option.

RESPONSE TO COMMENT LETTER NO. 1 Mr. Scott Morgan, Acting Director State of California Office of Planning and Research, State Clearinghouse September 2, 2009
