#### **AGREEMENT**

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THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered, in duplicate, as of May 3, 2019 for reference purposes only, pursuant to Resolution No. RES-19-0060 adopted by the City Council of the City of Long Beach at its meeting on April 23, 2019, by and between GOVDEALS, INC., a Delaware corporation ("Contractor"), whose address is 100 Capitol Commerce Blvd., Suite 110, Montgomery, Alabama 36117, and the CITY OF LONG BEACH ("City"), a municipal corporation.

WHEREAS, Section 1802 of the Long Beach City Charter permits the City to make purchases under the purchasing contracts of other governmental agencies when authorized to do so by a resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City has a need for surplus auction services with related solutions; and

WHEREAS, Sourcewell, formerly known as the National Joint Powers Alliance, has a contract with GovDeals, Inc. for surplus auction services with related solutions, Contract No. 041316-GDI ("Sourcewell Contract"); and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. RES-19-0060 authorizes the City to purchase surplus auction services with related solutions by virtue of the Sourcewell Contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms, covenants, and conditions in this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Sourcewell Contract with Contractor, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", is incorporated by this reference as if fully set forth, and the same terms and conditions contained in the Sourcewell Contract shall be applicable here except as follows:
  - A. Wherever the Sourcewell Contract refers to the National Joint Powers Alliance, it shall be deemed to refer to the City of Long Beach;
  - B. Contractor shall provide surplus auction services with related solutions of the same kind identified in the Sourcewell Contract, except as modified by Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated by this reference, in an

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amount not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000), until the Sourcewell contract expires on June 22, 2020, with the option to renew for as long as the Sourcewell Contract is in effect, at the discretion of the City Manager. To the extent that the Sourcewell Contract and this Agreement are inconsistent, the following priority shall govern: (1) this Agreement and (2) the Sourcewell Contract.

- C. Payment for the surplus auction services with related solutions purchased from Contractor by the City shall be made by the City on delivery to and acceptance of the surplus auction services with related solutions by the City and submittal of an invoice to the City. Payment is due thirty (30) days after the date of the invoice.
  - D. All warranties shall accrue to the City of Long Beach.
- 2. Neither this Agreement nor any money that becomes due to Contractor under this Agreement may be assigned by Contractor without the prior written consent of the City Manager or his designee.
- 3. Any notice given under this Agreement shall be in writing and personally delivered or deposited in the U.S. Postal Service, return receipt, and shall be delivered or mailed to Contractor at the relevant address first stated above, and to the City at 333 West Ocean Boulevard, Long Beach, California 90802 Attn: City Manager. Notice shall be deemed given three days after deposit in the mail.
- The terms appearing on the Sourcewell Contract are incorporated in this Agreement.
- 5. Contractor shall cooperate with the City in all matters relating to selfaccrual of use tax. Contractor shall contact the City Treasurer for additional information regarding self-accrual.
- 6. This Agreement and all documents which are incorporated by reference in this Agreement constitute the entire understanding between the parties and supersede all other agreements, oral or written, with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement.

A large number of our clients elect to leverage GovDeals fully integrated and secure Financial Settlement Services (FSS) feature, allowing GovDeals will accept payment online from winning bidders. GovDeals remits each Client's net proceeds weekly, with.

GovDeals' system and service is designed to be used "at will" and as needed by each NJPA Member. The GovDeals platform is available for use 24/7 at the convenience of the Member. As we are providing a revenue-generating service. GovDeals does not require purchase orders. If the Member is required to issue purchase orders. GovDeals' Accounting Department will verify the payment amount and return the P.O. and invoice in compliance with the Member's procedures.

To simplify the onboarding process, the GovDeals website enables Members to sign-up online and designate NJPA as their contracting vehicle. GovDeals will receive this one-fime "order," and the Member's account will be established according to the options chosen at sign-up.

GovDeals recognizes the importance and value of cooperative contracts and partner relationships. One of the company's senior managers, Christy Logan, oversees these partnerships. Contract compilance is ensured through quarterly and monthly reports detailing participating agencies' contract activity, as well as timely payment of applicable cooperative fees or revenue sharing. We have backend functionality in place to report all sales under the cooperative contract. GovDeals' system functionality also includes a simple way for NJPA fo review the cooperative usage of its contract, and each cooperative agency's sales amount is included on this report, which NJPA may access at any time within its GovDeals account.

Yes, GovDeals accepts P-cards. There is no additional fee to use this service.

Rather, GovDeals makes a threefold pledge to NJPA that (1) its auction platform will be reliable and secure for NJPA Members and auction bldders; (2) GovDeals will shoulder liability of fraudulent financial transactions for Members who participate in our Financial Settlement Services program; and (3) GovDeals will provide service and support to NJPA Members through locally based CSRs and Sales Representatives, as well as Marketing, Accounting, Bidder Services, IT Support, and effective management oversight. We would be happy to discuss these matters in detail and provide documentation of our successful performance of these fundamental commitments.

- 1). GovDeals commits to maintain and operate its online auction system with an uptime percentage of 99.99%, aside from regularly scheduled maintenance, and Members will be notified prior to any such scheduled downtime.
- 2) GovDeals' flduciary responsibilities to NJPA and its Members are guaranteed through a \$5,000,000 insurance policy.   - GovDeals, in selling and billing a service, has very few pricing variables and they are based on the same criteria for all selling clients, whether under confract or not. Once a client account is established, the pricing is a fixed percentage of the price items sell for an GovDeals.com, Because of this, all pricing and pricing changes require management approval. We have established system utilities that track cooperative member sales in a real time report and this data is archived and essentially available, ad hoc, at any time. One senior staff person is dedicated to verifying the accuracy of the quarterly report and presenting it to a senior manager for payment approval. These same utilities and processes are in place for the Annual Volume Discount Program (AVDP) that has returned approximately \$375,000 in rebates directly to NJPA members for their contract sales during the current 5 year contract period.

  - GovDeals proposes to pay 2% of what we are paid for our services. Example: A member utilizes the NJPA contract to sell an item for \$1,000 on GovDeals and the fee for this member is 12.5%. GovDeals is paid \$125 which represents the gross profif for the transaction. GovDeals will remit 2% of the \$125 (\$2.50) to NJPA when it makes its quarterly payment.
