ORDINANCE NO. C- 6835

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AMENDING ORDINANCE

NO. C-5869, ADOPTED JULY 29, 1982, ESTABLISHING THE BLUFF PARK HISTORIC LANDMARK DISTRICT

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

Section 1. Ordinance No. C-5869, adopted July 29, 1982, is amended in its entirety to read as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. C-5869

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING THE
BLUFF PARK AREA AS AN HISTORIC

LANDMARK DISTRICT

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

District. Pursuant to the provisions of Section

2.63.010, et seq., of the Municipal Code (Ordinance No. C-5364) and with the recommendation of the Planning Commission, the City Council of the City of Long Beach hereby designates the area known as Bluff Park as an Historic Landmark District:

(a) <u>Bluff Park Historic Landmark District</u>:

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Location and Description. The boundaries of the Bluff Park Historic Landmark District are set forth in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference. Historically, Bluff Park Landmark District is a residential neighborhood of single-family and multifamily houses. There are no businesses, churches, or public buildings in the district. variety of architectural styles appears in the houses constructed in the district during the period of principal development, 1903-1949. The State Historic Resources Inventory identified sixty-five such houses within the original district as significant examples of recognized architectural styles. The City cultural resource survey for the district expansion identified one hundred and nine buildings as contributing to the historic architectural character of the district. Within these architecturally rich streets, there are common elements creating a neighborhood that is visually continuous. Information on these architectural styles is found in Appendices I and II which are attached hereto.

(b) General Guidelines and Standards for any
Changes. The following guidelines have been formulated
to ensure that construction in the district preserves
and enhances this architectural continuity. The guidelines are an aid to public and private property owners,
and others, formulating plans for new construction, for
rehabilitation or alteration of existing structures,

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and for site development. The quidelines pertain to buildings of all occupancy and construction types, sizes and materials, and pertain to construction on the exterior of existing buildings as well as to new, attached or adjacent construction, and to site development, landscaping and other details.

The guidelines are also designed to be standards which the Cultural Heritage Commission shall apply when making decisions about Certificates of Appropriateness as required by the City of Long Beach Cultural Heritage Ordinance.

"General Standards and Guidelines for Historic Landmarks and Historic Districts for the City of Long Beach" shall also apply.

## Standards and Guidelines

- Existing Structures Α.
- Demolitions, alterations, and environmental changes shall be regulated by the terms of the Cultural Heritage Ordinance. Items needing a Certificate of Appropriateness from the Cultural Heritage Commission:
  - Architecture. (a)
  - Alteration to roof line. (1)
- (2) Addition or alteration of architectural elements of roof.
  - (3) Substitution of roof materials.
  - Alteration or addition to facade. (4)
  - (5) Alteration to windows-door design/pattern.
  - Alteration to architectural detailing and (6)

ornamentation, including:

- a. balustrades
- b. porches
- c. dormer windows
- d. portes-cochère
- e. filigree
- f. any other changes affecting the aesthetic appearance of the structure
  - (7) Room addition-external appearance.
  - (8) Alterations to structure foundation.
  - (b) Landscape Features
- (1) Alteration and/or relocation of walkways and driveways.
  - (2) Alteration to fencing.
- (3) Substitution or removal of any trees over six inches caliper.
- (4) All applicable building, safety and health codes and the property maintenance ordinance shall be observed.
  - B. New Construction or Alterations
- 1. Construction in the Bluff Park District shall conform to the bulk mass, scale and height of the majority of existing structures on both sides of the street on the block on which the new structure is to be erected.
- 2. The style of architecture, use of materials and the landscape treatment shall not be uncharacteristically different from the predominant style of

- 3. New structures shall not be painted or otherwise finished on the exterior in colors and architectural details which would be out of character with the general architectural style prominent on the block on which the new structure is to be located.
- 4. Driveways and garage entrances shall conform to the existing standard on the block on which the new building is to be erected. For example, if the standard is alley access to garage, then new structures shall not have street access.
- 5. Major new landscape features, such as trees and large shrubs shall conform to the general species of plant material and design style on the block on which the new building is to be erected. Existing trees should be preserved if at all possible. Landscape features reflecting the era and architectural style of the new structures shall be encouraged.
- 6. All applicable building, safety and health codes shall be observed.
  - C. Project Review

All project review shall be performed in accordance with the City of Long Beach Cultural Heritage Ordinance.

Sec. 2. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by the City Council and cause it to be posted in three conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach, and it




