#### Education

Funding for nearly all forms of transportation


#### Housing

## Hard-to-Count Areas




#### Socioeconomic & Housing Characteristics

- People Older Than 25 With Less Than a High School Diploma
- People Who Are Unemployed
- Non-Family Households
- Single-Parent Households
- People living in "Low Visibility Housing"
- Renters and Temporary Residents
- Overcrowded Households





# Group Quarters and Transitory Locations Enumeration



## **Group Quarters and Transitory Locations Enumeration**

#### What is a Group Quarter?

- A place where people who are usually not related that live or stay in a group living arrangement that is owned or managed by an entity or organization providing housing and/or services for its residents
- Services may include custodial or medical care as well as other types of assistance
- Residency restricted to people receiving services





## **Types of Group Quarters**

#### **Group Quarter Examples**

- Group homes
- Nursing Facilities
- Residential Treatment Centers
- College/University Housing
  - Dorms
  - Apartment-style housing
  - Fraternity and Sorority Houses
- Correctional Facilities
- Hospitals
- Service-Based Group Quarters





## **Service-Based Group Quarters**

#### What is a Service-Based Group Quarter?

 A place where people experiencing homelessness receive shelter or services

#### **Service-Based Group Quarter Examples**

- Soup kitchens
- Emergency and Transitional Shelters for people experiencing homelessness
- Regularly Scheduled Mobile Food Vans
- Targeted Non-Sheltered Outdoor Locations





## **Group Quarters Enumeration**

#### **Three Phases:**

- 1. Group Quarters Advanced Contact
- Service-Based Enumeration and Targeted Non-Sheltered Outdoor Locations
  - Three days in late March
  - Includes shelters, soup kitchens, food vans, outdoor locations
- 3. Group Quarters Enumeration
  - Institutional and Non-Institutional
  - In-Person or eResponse





## **Transitory Locations**

#### What is a Transitory Location?

 A location where people live in non-traditional housing that is transient or movable in nature

#### **Transitory Location Examples:**

- RV Parks
- Campgrounds
- Circuses
- Carnivals
- Marinas
- Hotels/Motels





## **Transitory Locations Enumeration**

#### **Two Phases:**

- 1. Advanced Contact
  - In-Office Operation
  - Set Up Enumeration
- 2. Enumeration of Transitory Locations
  - In-Person





## Differences in Enumeration Approach

- Respondents in Group Quarters and Transitory Locations will not get postcards and letters in the mail
- Respondents have the same confidentiality and privacy rights as all other respondents
- Continued collaborations and meetings with Los Angeles County, City of Los Angeles, US Census Bureau, and California Complete Count Committee
