New Fiscal Year Brings Support for Parks, Recreation & Marine Programs

The 2020 General Fund budget for Parks, Recreation and Marine (PRM) began on October 1 and supports some minor enhancements in staffing levels that will go a long way towards improving customer service and the quality of PRM programs and services.



It is estimated that 345,000 vehicles and over 1 million people will have entered El Dorado East Regional Park (EDE) in fiscal year 2019. EDE issues hundreds of Permits to Gather, Picnic Site Permits and Youth Group Camping permits each year. Two part time Recreation Leader Specialist V positions have been

added to focus on permit compliance and entry gate operations and make visits more enjoyable for the public.

To continue Long Beach Animal Care Service's (LBACS) progress in reducing euthanasia and increasing adoptions, a new and permanent Adoption Coordinator will oversee adoption and volunteer programs

with support from a new Clerk I. These positions will strengthen LBACS's "Compassion Saves" operating model that commits to no healthy or treatable animal being euthanized without a search for a positive outcome, and strengthening collaborations with rescue partners and volunteers.



Volunteers are the backbone behind PRM senior citizen programs, Long Beach Animal Care Services, El Dorado Nature Center activities and community support for park and beach maintenance, among other programs. With more than 100 community partners interested in supporting the PRM mission and the need to enhance programs with the help of volunteers, the addition of a new Recreation Assistant to recruit and train interested citizens is a great example of "a little going a long way."

California Coastal Cleanup Day Supports Local Waterways

The community came together to make a positive impact on local marine life by volunteering at the California Coastal Cleanup Day on September 21. This annual event draws more than 65,000 volunteers statewide in a joint effort to clean up waterways and coastlines.



El Dorado Nature Center staff coordinated Long Beach's cleanup efforts, in cooperation with the Aquarium of the Pacific, Long Beach Marine Institute, Friends of Colorado Lagoon, the Seal Beach Yacht Club and Clean LB.

A total of 1,226 volunteers picked up 2,376 pounds of trash from Alamitos Bay Marina, Belmont Veterans Memorial Pier, Cherry Beach, Colorado Lagoon, the Peninsula area and around the Sea Scout Base.

Jenni Rivera Park Playground Construction Underway

A groundbreaking event took place on September 23 for the new Measure A-funded Jenni Rivera Park playground. The park is located at 2001 Walnut Avenue.



The new playground will include pour-in-place rubberized surfacing and play elements appropriate for ages 5-12. The playground will be adjacent to the park's bike and pedestrian path, and across from the 125-foot long mural depicting the late singer Jenni Rivera's life and love of her hometown, Long Beach.

The 3-acre park was dedicated on July 2, 2015. The park provides open space along the Pacific Electric Right of Way between Orange and Walnut Avenues.

Gumbiner Park has been recognized for "Innovative Urban Design" in *Fast Company's* 2019 Innovation by Design Awards. Gumbiner Park is featured in their October print

Long Beach's most dangerous intersection was transformed into Gumbiner Park. The project realigned a complicated convergence of five intersections into three intersections and closed one block of roadway to create the park. The project improved safety and pedestrian



circulation while creating a one-acre public open space for a park poor community in Central Long Beach. The park was dedicated on April 19, 2017.

A 2010 analysis conducted on intersections with high collision rates ranked the joining of Martin Luther King Ave. and Seventh St. as the most hazardous, with 38 injury accidents in the preceding five years and an average of 23 overall accidents annually. In the year following the decoupling, collisions on 7th Street dropped to 27 per year and 6th Street dropped to 13 per year within the project limits. The street realignment made the intersections safer.

Parks, Recreation and Marine Strategic Plan Update



Long Beach Parks, Recreation, and Marine Department (PRM) is well underway with an effort to create a new strategic plan that will cover a 10-year period, from 2020-2030, and will guide operational, staffing and budgeting decisions for the Department.

A community survey available in the City's four languages was widely promoted at all community centers and summer events and was completed in August. PRM staff also participated by identifying what they felt were "strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats" in the PRM operation. The information from the community and staff surveys is being analyzed.

In early 2020, PRM will invite community members to share their ideas at community conversations and PRM Director listening sessions in all City Council Districts.

Know Your Long Beach Parks: Craftsman Village Park



Craftsman Village Park is located at 851 Orange Avenue in the historic Craftsman Village Hellman neighborhood. The .3-acre park's amenities include Craftsman inspired fencing, lighting and entry features; native plantings, trees, walkways, benches and picnic tables as well as a small turf area and play elements.

The park incorporates water saving features such as drought tolerant material and efficient irrigation systems.

The community welcomed the opening of the park on September 14, 2013 as new open space to serve a park deficient area.

The project was funded by a \$722,465 grant from the Proposition 84 Urban Parks Grant.

Free After School Programs Going on Now in Long Beach Parks



Long Beach Parks, Recreation and Marine (PRM) offers free after school activities for children (5-12) and teens (13-18) in parks throughout the city. Activities offered include arts and crafts, games and sports. Homework assistance is also available. The sixteen centers are within walking distance of area high schools and help build friendships through fun activities

that promote confidence-building and talent discovery. "From crafts and cooking to homework help and sport tournaments, PRM staff create a safe and positive environment for youth," said Parks, Recreation and Marine Director Gerardo Mouet. "The after-school programs also enhance social skills, teach responsibility and leadership and promote positive self-esteem."
