HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL City of Long Beach California

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution redeclaring a shelter crisis; suspending applicable provisions of local law, including those contained in the City's zoning ordinances and regulations, and authorizing the operation of a temporary shelter, for the period of April 1, 2020 through September 30, 2020, inclusive; and,

Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to execute a Lease, including any necessary related documents and amendments, with the United States Veterans Initiative (Lessee), or assignee, for City-owned property at 5571 Orange Avenue for use as a temporary shelter. (District 8)

DISCUSSION

The County of Los Angeles (County) and the City of Los Angeles provide funding to the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) through a Joint Powers Agreement to oversee countywide homeless services and to operate the Winter Shelter Program (Program). As the administrative authority, LAHSA is responsible for selecting the Program providers through a competitive application process, contracting with providers, and overseeing Program operations. The Program is a coordinated effort to increase the number of temporary emergency shelter beds available in the County during the period from December 1 through March 31, when the region usually experiences its most inclement weather. As such, the County places winter shelters in each of the five Supervisorial Districts. For Los Angeles County Supervisorial District 4, the location identified is at 1718-1722 Hayes Avenue (Hayes Site) in Long Beach.

At its meeting on November 12, 2019, the City Council adopted Resolution RES-19-0178 declaring a shelter crisis, pursuant to California Government Code Sections 8698.1 and 8698.2, which allow local jurisdictions to suspend local laws and regulations "to the extent that strict compliance would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay the mitigation of the effects of the shelter crisis" for any City-owned, leased or maintained property. In addition, the City Council authorized the City Manager to execute Lease No. 35431 with the United States Veterans Initiative, for its oversight of the Program at the Hayes Site. On March 17, 2020, the City Council authorized the First Amendment to Lease No. 35431 extending the Program at the Hayes Site until September 30, 2020.

In light of the recent COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent requirement for social distancing, the Hayes Site can no longer support the appropriate number of beds and maintain the recommended minimum distance of six feet between persons. The City has identified the former North Neighborhood Library at 5571 Orange Avenue (Orange Site) as a potential location to relocate a portion of the beds from the Hayes Site, allowing both locations to adhere to the appropriate social distancing requirements. The Orange Site remains vacant while development plans are being pursued and has recently been the subject of vandalism and dumping. Utilizing the Orange Site will not only help deter criminal activity, but also allow the Program to maintain its current bed count of 125. To facilitate the use of the Orange Site, a Lease between the City and the United States Veterans Initiative has been negotiated by the Economic Development Department. The proposed Lease contains the following major terms and provisions:

- <u>Lessor:</u> City of Long Beach, a municipal corporation.
- <u>Lessee:</u> The United States Veterans Initiative, a California nonprofit corporation.
- <u>Leased Premises</u>: The former North Neighborhood Library at 5571 Orange Avenue, which includes a 7,318-square-foot building and appurtenant parking.
- <u>Use:</u> The Leased Premises will be used for the relocation of a portion of beds from the winter shelter at 1718-1722 Hayes Avenue.
- <u>Term</u>: The Lease will commence April 1, 2020 and terminate on September 30, 2020.
- <u>Rent:</u> The City will not charge rent.
- <u>Utilities and Incidentals</u>: The City will pay for all costs associated with utilities and incidental costs for the Leased Premises.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Richard F. Anthony and Budget Manager Grace H. Yoon on March 19, 2020.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on March 24, 2020, to facilitate execution of the Lease.

FISCAL IMPACT

The Lessor will not charge the Lessee any rent for the use of this space and will pay for all costs associated with utilities and incidentals for the Leased Premises. Anticipated costs for utilities are estimated to be approximately \$20,000 per month, totaling an estimated \$120,000 for the life of the Lease. On February 18, 2020, as part of the Fiscal Year 2019 Year-End

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Budget Performance Report, the City Council approved the staff recommendation to set aside \$120,000 to support the extension of the City's interim shelter. These funds were appropriated in the General Fund Group in the Health and Human Services Department on March 17, 2020 as part of the City Council-approved First Departmental and Fund Budget Adjustment letter. The Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) has agreed to fund the extension program; therefore, staff are recommending utilizing the \$120,000 toward utility costs. This recommendation has no staffing impact beyond the normal budgeted scope of duties and is consistent with existing City Council priorities. There is no local job impact associated with this recommendation.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH REDECLARING A SHELTER CRISIS; SUSPENDING APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF LOCAL LAW, INCLUDING THOSE CONTAINED IN THE CITY'S ZONING ORDINANCES AND REGULATIONS; AND AUTHORIZING THE OPERATION OF AN INTERIM SHELTER AT 5571 ORANGE AVENUE, IN THE CITY OF LONG BEACH, BETWEEN THE DATES OF APRIL 1, 2020 AND SEPTEMBER 30, 2020, INCLUSIVE

WHEREAS, the purpose and intent of this resolution is to continue to provide shelter and supportive services for the homeless in the City of Long Beach by maintaining such services at, and allowing the use of, the real property located at 5571 Orange Avenue, in the City of Long Beach, between the dates of April 1, 2020 and 17 September 30, 2020, inclusive; and

18 WHEREAS, at its meeting of November 12, 2019, the City Council of the 19 City of Long Beach adopted Resolution No. RES-19-0178 redeclaring a "shelter crisis" 20 pursuant to SB 850 (Chapter 48, Statutes of 2018 and Government Code Sections 21 8698.1 and 8698.2); and

22 WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code section 8698.1 et seq., the City 23 Council hereby finds and re-declares that there still exists a "shelter crisis" in that a 24 significant number of persons within the City are without the ability to obtain shelter, and 25 that the situation has resulted in, and will continue to result in, a threat to the health and 26 safety of those persons; and

27 WHEREAS, at its meeting on March 17, 2020, the City Council authorized 28 the City Manager to execute a Lease with the United States Veterans Initiative to operate

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1 || the shelter at 1718-1722 Hayes Avenue, in the City of Long Beach; and

WHEREAS, in light of the recent COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent
requirement for social distancing, the Hayes site can no longer support the appropriate
number of beds and maintain the recommended minimum distance of 6 feet between
persons; and

6 WHEREAS, both locations are needed to adhere to the appropriate social
7 distancing requirements;

8 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as 9 follows:

Section 1. That the provisions of any state or local regulatory statute,
regulation or ordinance, including but not limited to the City's zoning regulations
prescribing standards of use, housing, health or safety shall be suspended with respect
to the above-described interim shelter to the extent that strict compliance would in any
way prevent, hinder or delay the operation of the interim shelter during the declared
shelter crisis.

Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provisions of local law, the City
Manager is hereby authorized and directed to take all steps as may be reasonably
necessary or appropriate to facilitate the operation of an interim shelter between the
dates of April 1, 2020 and September 30, 2020, which shelter is to be located at 5571
Orange Avenue, in the City of Long Beach.

Section 3. Any and all provisions of the City's Zoning Ordinance and
regulations, which otherwise might regulate, apply to or govern the continued operation of
the interim shelter, are hereby suspended and declared inapplicable to the proposed
interim homeless shelter.

Section 4. The City Manager, or his designee, is hereby authorized to
develop such rules and regulations related to health and safety standards which the City
Manager deems necessary and appropriate to protect the public health, safety and
welfare of the residents of an interim shelter and those residents and/or businesses

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OFFICE OF THE CITY ATTORNEY CHARLES PARKIN, City Attorney 411 West Ocean Boulevard, 9th Floor Lond Beach. CA 90802 which may be affected by the operation of said shelter. To the extent applicable to those
 homeless individuals who occupy the shelter, such rules and regulations may be posted
 in at least one conspicuous location on the site.

Section 5. Pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"),
Public Resources Code section 21000, et seq., the Council hereby finds that this project
is exempt from further environmental review under CEQA Guidelines 15301.

Section 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption
by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
