#### DISCUSSION

At the City Council meeting of August 11, 2009, Third District Councilmember Gary DeLong requested that the City Council consider including duplex projects as possible impact fee exemptions. A motion to send the item to the Housing and Neighborhoods Committee for review was approved.

### **BACKGROUND**

The Municipal Code imposes impact fees on specified new development projects. The code provides exemptions for replacement of 'like for like' single-family dwellings. The exempted fees are for Transportation Improvement, Police Facilities, Fire Facilities and Park and Recreation Facility Fees.

The Park and Recreation fee also provides an exemption for replacement of duplexes. The other three impact fees do not have a similar exemption for duplexes.

**Impact Fee Exemptions** 

Current building impact fees allow for exemptions on "like for like" replacement single-family dwelling projects. The exempted fees are in Transportation Improvement, Police Facilities, Fire Facilities, and Park and Recreation Facility fees.

The Park and Recreation fee also has an exemption for duplexes, but the other three impact fees are not included. After discussions with staff, it would seem appropriate to also exempt these three additional fees for "like for like" duplex replacement projects.

Municipal Code Sections:

- Chapter 18.17 Transportation Improvement Fee (Section 18.17.130 provides exemption)
- Chapter 18.18 Park and Recreation Facility Fee (Section 18.18.120 provides exemptions)
- Chapter 18.22 Police Facilities Impact Fee (Section 18.22.110 provides exemptions and credits)
- Chapter 18.23 Fire Facilities Impact Fee (Section 18.23.110 provides exemptions and credits)

Suggested Action: Respectfully request that the City Attorney work with Development Services to revise the municipal code to include single-family and duplex projects as possible impact fee exemptions.
