Digital Inclusion Initiative Overview

Inclusion Initiative (Initiative) uplifts digital equity which means ensuring everyone has access and use of digital literacy training, the Internet and technology devices to be successful in society, democracy and the economy regardless of their background and identity.

Three-Legged Stool of Digital Inclusion



- Low-cost, high-speed, quality in-home Internet services.
- Low-cost, quality, Internetenabled technology devices and support.
- Multilingual digital literacy training and support.

National Recognition



- The City is one of fourteen jurisdictions in the country named a 2020 Digital Inclusion Trailblazer by the National Digital Inclusion Alliance (NDIA).
- Digital Inclusion Trailblazers is an honor roll of local government initiatives that promote digital literacy and broadband Internet access for underserved residents.
- This is the second time the City has received this recognition.

State Recognition



- In April 2019, the Initiative received the Excellence in Public Information and Communications Award of Distinction under the Social Media Campaign Category.
- These awards are presented annually by the California Association of Public Information Officials (CAPIO) to honor outstanding public agency information and communications programs.
- The Initiative received this award for successfully developing and implementing the City's 2018 International Digital Inclusion Week (IDIW) Social Media Engagement Campaign.

Digital Inclusion Roadmap Development Update

- The City is co-creating a Digital Inclusion Roadmap (strategic plan) with community members and local cross-sector partners.
- This Roadmap will be a blueprint for ensuring that everyone in Long Beach has equitable access and use of digital literacy training, the Internet, technology devices and other digital inclusion resources.
- The foundation of the Roadmap will include a vision statement, goals, objectives, performance indicators and strategies for advancing digital inclusion through a collective impact approach and equity lens in the following focus areas (e.g. capacity, connectivity, technology).

Stakeholder Engagement Update

- City staff have convened four Digital Inclusion
 Stakeholder Committee (Committee)
 meetings.
- The 50-person multidisciplinary Committee is providing strategic guidance, vision and oversight on the development of the Roadmap.
- The Committee represents a broad range of sectors including members of the community, public libraries, City departments, private technology companies, community-based organizations, K-12/higher education institutions and Internet service providers to name a few.
- City staff is contracting with McCormick L.A. to implement stakeholder facilitation and engagement efforts.

Community Engagement Update

- City staff have started community outreach and engagement efforts.
- City staff is contracting with Pueblo Planning to engage communities most affected by the digital divide through community pop-ups, community workshops and a community forum.
- City staff are implementing equitable and inclusive community outreach and engagement approaches that include partnering with local trusted community partners.
- During the community engagement process, community members have had the opportunity to use artmaking and storytelling as a way to share their knowledge and lived experiences for the Roadmap.

Digital Inclusion Community Pop-Ups Update

- City staff hosted three Digital Inclusion
 Community Pop-ups. The purpose is to engage the
 Long Beach community in conversations (5-10
 minutes) about the:
 - Digital Inclusion Initiative
 - ✓ Digital Inclusion Roadmap development
 - √ 2020 Census efforts
 - ✓ Potential digital inclusion strategies
- The community pop-up activity is visually appealing and brought together Long Beach community members and started conversations around digital equity and inclusion.
- Participants had an opportunity to provide input and feedback on potential strategies for the Roadmap.

Digital Inclusion Community Workshops Update

- Thus far, City staff have hosted two Digital Inclusion Community Workshops. The purpose is to engage community members through artmaking and storytelling to learn more about:
 - ✓ What they want to use the Internet and computers for?
 - ✓ What is currently working?
 - ✓ Identify challenges, barriers and solutions.
 - ✓ Get feedback on the strategies for the Roadmap.
- During the development and implementation of the Digital Inclusion Community Workshops, the City is partnering with local trusted community partners:
 - ✓ Centro CHA
 - ✓ Long Beach Forward
 - United Cambodian Community (UCC)
 - ✓ YMCA of Greater Long Beach Community Development

Digital Inclusion Community Forum Update

- The purpose of the Digital Inclusion Community
 Forum is for Long Beach community members
 and stakeholders to learn more about the
 Initiative and Roadmap development process.
- This will be an interactive communityfriendly space where the City will showcase the co-developed draft vision statement, goals, objectives and strategies for the Roadmap.
- Community members and stakeholders will have an opportunity to provide additional feedback and input on the draft Roadmap deliverables before they are finalized.
- In addition, the City will be coordinating a resource fair at the Forum where community members and stakeholders can connect to local digital inclusion resources and services.

Digital Inclusion Roadmap Development Next Steps

- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent guidance for physical distancing, the City has postponed upcoming community engagement events until further notice.
- As a result, this will delay the completion date of the Roadmap which was scheduled for July 2020.
- Once Long Beach reopens, City staff will determine new project dates for the Roadmap development process including Committee meetings and community engagement events.

COVID-19 Digital Inclusion Response

- The COVID-19 pandemic has significantly heightened the digital divide.
- The City is convening the COVID-19 Digital Inclusion Response Working Group to ensure that unconnected and underconnected communities in Long Beach have equitable access and use of digital literacy training, the Internet and technology devices.
- The Working Group will convene virtually on a bi-weekly basis and implement COVID-19 digital inclusion strategies through partnerships, collaboration and funding opportunities.

COVID-19 Digital Inclusion Response

- The Working Group will be prioritizing **short-term** and **quick win strategies** (e.g. strategies that can be implemented in the **next three to six months**) in the following focus areas:
 - Short-term/quick win strategies from the draft Digital Inclusion Roadmap (Roadmap).
 - ✓ Strategies recommended from the National Digital Inclusion Alliance (NDIA) <u>Local</u>
 <u>Government COVID-19 Digital Inclusion</u>
 <u>Response</u>.
 - ✓ Digital Inclusion-related strategies recommended as part of the City's approved <u>Economic Relief Package</u>.
 - Strategies recommended from the Working Group.

Next Steps and Closing

- City staff will continue to identify funding opportunities, partnerships and legislation that will advance digital equity and inclusion in Long Beach.
- During the COVID-19 pandemic, City staff will continue to adjust and modify digital inclusion efforts and ensure they align with the current needs of the Long Beach community.
