RES-20-0064 1 2 3 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH RATIFYING THE DIRECTOR OF 4 5 CIVIL DEFENSE'S PROCLAMATION OF THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY AND CONFIRMING THE 6 7 DIRECTOR'S REGULATIONS PROCLAIMING LOCAL **EMERGENCY CURFEWS** 8 9 10 WHEREAS, on May 25, 2020, George Floyd tragically died in Minneapolis, 11 Minnesota, shortly after his detention and arrest by the Minneapolis Police Department 12 resulting in nationwide grief, as well as widespread demonstrations; 13 WHEREAS, unfortunately, despite the peaceful intentions and actions of the 14 majority of protestors, many areas around the country, including Los Angeles County, 15 faced and continue to face actual or threatened civil unrest including but not limited to acts 16 of arson, vandalism, rioting, assault, and looting; and 17 WHEREAS, on May 30, 2020, due to ongoing acts of civil unrest and limited 18 local resources, Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed a State of Emergency for all of Los 19 Angeles County in accordance with the California Emergency Services Act (in particular, 20 Government Code section 8625), and directed all residents to heed the advice of local 21 emergency officials with respect to the emergency existing by virtue of said civil unrest; 22 and 23 WHEREAS, Section 2.69.060 of the Long Beach Municipal Code empowers 24 the Director of Civil Defense (City Manager) of the City of Long Beach to proclaim, when 25 the Long Beach City Council is not in session, the existence or threatened existence of a 26 local emergency when said City is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity; and 27 WHEREAS, conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property 28 were anticipated to and did so arise within the City caused by civil unrest, including but not

 demonstrations; and

WHEREAS, the Council does hereby find that the aforesaid conditions of extreme peril did warrant and necessitate the proclamation of the existence of a local emergency, and other emergency actions as deemed necessary; and

6 WHEREAS, the Director of Civil Defense of the City of Long Beach did 7 proclaim the existence of a local emergency within the City on May 31, 2020; and

8 WHEREAS, the Director of Civil Defense of the City of Long Beach did issue 9 regulations proclaiming local emergency curfews within the City commencing on May 31, 10 2020, and ending on June 4, 2020, and may continue to issue such curfew regulations as 11 he may deem necessary in accordance with his authorized duties, to be later confirmed by 12 the City Council at the earliest time practicable;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that
 said proclamation of existence of a local emergency, as issued by the Director of Civil
 Defense on May 31, 2020, is hereby ratified by the City Council pursuant to Section
 2.69.060(B)(1) of the Long Beach Municipal Code; and

17 IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that said local emergency
18 shall be deemed to continue to exist until its termination is proclaimed by the City Council.
19 The City Council shall review the need for continuing this local emergency at least every
20 14 days and shall terminate it at the earliest possible date the conditions warrant; and

21 IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that pursuant to Section 22 2.69.070(A) of the Long Beach Municipal Code, the City Council hereby confirms the local 23 emergency curfews, as issued by the Director of Civil Defense, which ordered that all 24 persons, except certain individuals such as law enforcement and firefighting personnel, 25 emergency health care providers, emergency medical personnel, civilians engaged in 26 police or emergency work, individuals seeking emergency care, individuals traveling to and 27 from their place of employment, representatives of the media, businesses closing up their 28 operation(s), persons experiencing homelessness and without viable access to shelter,

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commercial trucking and delivery services, and persons assisting with clean-up efforts of 1 2 any destruction resulting from civil unrest, are prohibited from being or traveling upon the public streets, avenues, alleys, parks, or any other public place, during the following dates 3 and times and at the following locations: 4 5 (1) Commencing on May 31, 2020, at 8:00 p.m., and expiring on June 1, 6 2020, at 5:00 a.m., citywide; 7 (2) Commencing on June 1, 2020, at 4:00 p.m., and expiring on June 2, 2020, 8 at 5:00 a.m., citywide; (3) Commencing on June 1, 2020, at 1:00 p.m., and expiring on June 2, 2020, 9 at 5:00 a.m., within the boundaries of the following Business Improvement Districts (BIDs) 10 or other business districts of the City of Long Beach as follows: 11 CHARLES PARKIN, City Attorney 411 West Ocean Boulevard, 9th Floor Long Beach, CA 90802-4664 12 **Belmont Shore PBIA/ Naples** a. 13 b. **Bixby Knolls PBIA** Downtown Long Beach PBIA 14 C.
