RESOLUTION NO. RES-20-0072

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH TERMINATING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY RELATED TO CIVIL UNREST

WHEREAS, on May 25, 2020, George Floyd tragically died in Minneapolis, Minnesota, shortly after his detention and arrest by the Minneapolis Police Department resulting in nationwide grief, as well as widespread demonstrations; and

WHEREAS, unfortunately, despite the peaceful intentions and actions of the majority of protestors, many areas around the country, including Los Angeles County, faced and/or continue to face actual or threatened civil unrest including but not limited to acts of arson, vandalism, rioting, assault, and looting; and

WHEREAS, on May 30, 2020, due to ongoing acts of civil unrest and limited local resources, Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed a State of Emergency for all of Los Angeles County in accordance with the California Emergency Services Act (in particular, Government Code section 8625), and directed all residents to heed the advice of local emergency officials with respect to the emergency existing by virtue of said civil unrest; and

WHEREAS, Section 2.69.060 of the Long Beach Municipal Code empowers the Director of Civil Defense (City Manager) of the City of Long Beach to proclaim, when the Long Beach City Council is not in session, the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when said City is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity; and

WHEREAS, conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property were anticipated to and did so arise within the City caused by civil unrest, including but not limited to arson, vandalism, and looting, commencing on or about May 31, 2020, following demonstrations; and

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WHEREAS, the City Council did find that the aforesaid conditions of extreme

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1 peril warranted and necessitated the proclamation of the existence of a local emergency, and other emergency actions as deemed necessary; and 2

WHEREAS, the Director of Civil Defense of the City of Long Beach did 3 proclaim the existence of a local emergency within the City on May 31, 2020; and 4

5 WHEREAS, on June 5, 2020, the City Council proclaimed and ordered that 6 said proclamation of existence of a local emergency, as issued by the Director of Civil 7 Defense on May 31, 2020, was ratified by the City Council pursuant to Section 8 2.69.060(B)(1) of the Long Beach Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council further proclaimed and ordered that said local emergency shall be deemed to continue to exist until its termination is proclaimed by the 10 City Council, and that the City Council shall review the need for continuing this local emergency at least every 14 days and shall terminate it at the earliest possible date the conditions warrant; and

14 WHEREAS, on June 9, 2020, the City Council reviewed the need for 15 continuing the local emergency and determined that the local emergency would continue 16 within the City of Long Beach at that time; and

17 WHEREAS, on June 16, 2020, the City Council again reviewed the need for 18 continuing the local emergency and determined that the conditions warranted termination 19 of the local emergency within the City of Long Beach; and

20 WHEREAS, specifically, the situation resulting from said conditions of extreme peril 21 is now deemed not to be beyond the control of normal protective services, personnel, 22 equipment, and facilities of and within the City of Long Beach;

23 NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that, 24 pursuant to Section 2.69.060(B)(1) of the Long Beach Municipal Code, and due to the 25 current conditions within the City of Long Beach, the City Council terminates the existence 26 of a local emergency, related to civil unrest, proclaimed by the Director of Civil Defense on 27 May 31, 2020, and ratified by the City Council on June 5, 2020.
