



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

I think redistricting can be an opportunity to reduce our equity gap by providing guidelines in a fair, non-partisan, and transparent manner.

I served as Chair of our Redevelopment Central Project Area Committee for five years, during which we produced the SE Area Specific Plan. As an example, LB is home to a large Cambodian population yet we famously don't have a Cambodian councilmember because the Cambodian population is split among three council districts, heavily diluting any political power they may have on council. Hispanics make up 40% of the city's population according to the 2010 Census, yet there are only two councilmembers of Latino/Hispanic origin.

As a field representative for a State Senator co-chairing the Census Committee for the State of California, I am already involved in efforts to promote the Census in Orange County and Long Beach. As the LB representative for that Senator, I frequently have to work with various groups, organizations, and people of different backgrounds in the City. As a political science and history major oftentimes I would have to use Census data and analyze demographic numbers for research and writing purposes. When it comes to cooperatively working with other commissioners, as a part of my job I frequently have to work with people of different ethnicities as well as religions, genders, political views. Working in the legislature requires coalition building to get bills passed. When it comes to impartiality, going back to working for the Senate, you help represent people with different views, backgrounds, ages, everything; but in doing so you have to remember that something people you represent want, might not be something you support. You have to advocate for the people you represent with your whole heart, whether or not you personally think that it's the right thing to do or support.






