Hello,

It is a pleasure to submit my resume to you as consideration for a position on the Independent Redistricting Commission. I have lived in Long Beach since 1974; in fact, I have lived in the same house since 1976. I believe in this City!

I have chosen to submit an abbreviated resume and take this opportunity to provide further details by highlighting three areas of my experience.

First: My professional mentors at the American Association of Retired Persons afforded me opportunity to develop and hone a complex set of managerial skills, skills which held me in good stead once I reached the University of California Irvine's doctoral program.

Second: At UCI, I had opportunity to instruct large numbers of students – up to 350 in a single class – and to supervise a range of graduate student Teaching Assistants – generally, 6 or 8 per quarter. Organizing lectures, developing exercises and exams for a culturally and racially diverse range of undergraduates, many of whom were non-native speakers of English and most of whom had no prior knowledge of the science of linguistics, required both constant creativity and control. Constructing work for the TAs in each class that was meaningful for them and helpful to me, while being ever mindful of the responsibilities each incurred as a doctoral student, required persistent vigilance and flexibility. And the managerial experience garnered at AARP proved central in all these responsibilities.

Of crucial significance, at UCI I developed an incredible appreciation for not only the differences among the some 8,000 human languages spoken on the planet but also how very similar these languages are at an underlying level; that is, widely geographically-spread language which appear superficially diverse in fact share a an extremely wide range of characteristics. This should not be surprising: All languages are products of human mind/brains; to the extent that all human mind/brains are similar, the languages so produced must share similarity. One truism is that all children, regardless of the culture in which they're raised and regardless of whether they're subjected to "motherese" or not, acquire the spoken or signed language to which they're exposed easily and without explicit instruction. Understanding and explaining these facts specify the goals of the science of linguistics. I'm confident that my research, which focused on cross-linguistic typology, added a small amount of knowledge to this science.

Third: Through my volunteer experience at Rebuilding Together Long Beach, I several new areas to my knowledge base: the complexities of home repair and construction, the distinct and diverse neighborhoods of Long Beach, the tremendous income and opportunity inequalities in the City, the boundaries of council districts and census tracks, and the pure pleasure of volunteering. I was able to meet many new people: City staff, local activists and community organizers, corporate and individual sponsors, willing volunteers – and way too many needy homeowners. Consequently, I grew to love the city and to promote it shamelessly to those who don't have the privilege of living here.

Because RTLB lacked an executive director through much of my tenure, my responsibilities – particularly as Board President – took on added importance, as I was responsible for ensuring the various committees (Finance, Site Selection, Volunteer Coordination, Construction, and so forth) were appropriately staffed, functioned at a high level, and worked together cooperatively. Again, my managerial experience, which began at AARP and continued through UCI, allowed me to carry out these efforts capably.



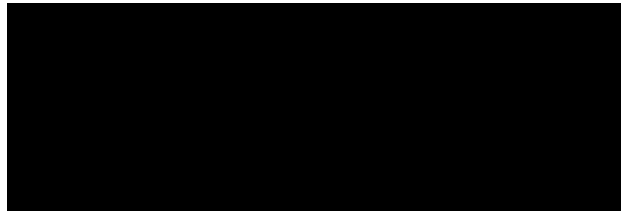
In sum, I believe I possess experience and knowledge that would be beneficial to the Independent Redistricting Commission. I know I would thoroughly enjoy being part of this group.
